Luke 10:1-12; 16-20

¹After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go. ²He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field. ³Go! I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. ⁴Do not take a purse or bag or sandals; and do not greet anyone on the road. ⁵"When you enter a house, first say, 'Peace to this house.' ⁶If a man of peace is there, your peace will rest on him; if not, it will return to you. ⁷Stay in that house, eating and drinking whatever they give you, for the worker deserves his wages. Do not move around from house to house.

Web Page

Jenkins has a new web page: www.jenkinscp.org. This web page is still a work in progress, and we will need your ideas and help to complete, but portions of it are complete so we encourage you to start using it.

Perhaps the most unique and exciting feature of this web page is the "sermon archives" section. An audio recording is made of each worship service and is available on the web page as soon as that worship service is over. You simply pick the date and the service (8:00 or 10:15) that you want to listen to and it plays over your computer's speakers!

The Bible commands us concerning the importance of coming together for worship:
Heb 10:25 Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another-and all the more as you see the Day approaching. (NIV)

But we have several homebound members who can't come regularly to worship, plus we all miss on occasion. Our prayer is that this "sermon archive" feature will help you to keep in touch with God and with the Jenkins church family on those days that you can't attend in person.

Other useful sections of the web page are the "newsletters" and "bulletins" sections. These store electronic (PDF) versions of recent newsletters and bulletins. We hope to have the bulletin posted by Saturday of each week so that you will have time to review it to better prepare and pray for the upcoming worship service.

Another feature of the web page is the "Member's Page". This is an area that is protected by a "user name" and "password". Only those members and friends of Jenkins who know a valid user name and password can get into the "Member's Page". This gives us a "safe place" to store sensitive information for access only by members and friends of Jenkins.

Please refer to the printed newsletter or contact the pastor to obtain the user name and password.

A prayer bulletin will be published on this page twice per week (Monday evenings in preparation for the Tuesday morning prayer group and on Saturday with updates in preparation for Sunday services).

Please check out the new web page and let your imagination go wild concerning how this technology can be used to facilitate God's work and bring Him glory. Anyone with a passion in a particular area (youth, committee, mission project, choir, work group, ...) and access to a computer, can be setup as an "editor" for that area of the web page. 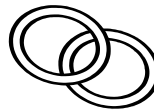
