## Philemon 4-22

<sup>4</sup>I always thank my God as I remember you in my prayers, <sup>5</sup>because I hear about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints. <sup>6</sup>I pray that you may be active in sharing your faith, so that you will have a full under -standing of every good thing we have in Christ. <sup>7</sup>Your love has given me great joy and encouragement, because you, brother, have refreshed the hearts of the saints.

<sup>8</sup>Therefore, although in Christ I could be bold and order you to do what you ought to do, <sup>9</sup>yet I appeal to you on the basis of love. I then, as Paul--an old man and now also a prisoner of Christ Jesus-- <sup>10</sup>I appeal to you for my son Onesimus, who became my son while I was in chains. <sup>11</sup>Formerly he was useless to you, but now he has become useful both to you and to me. <sup>12</sup>I am sending him--who is my very heart--back to you. <sup>13</sup>I would have liked to keep him with me so that he could take your place in helping me while I am in chains for the gospel. <sup>14</sup>But I did not want to do anything without your consent, so that any favor you do will be spontaneous and not forced. <sup>15</sup>Perhaps the reason he was separated from you for a little while was that you might have him back for good-- <sup>16</sup>no longer as a slave, but better than a slave, as a dear brother. He is very dear to me but even dearer to you, both as a man and as a brother in the Lord.

<sup>17</sup>So if you consider me a partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. <sup>18</sup>If he has done you any wrong or owes you anything, charge it to me. <sup>19</sup>I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand. I will pay it back--not to mention that you owe me your very self. <sup>20</sup>I do wish, brother, that I may have some benefit from you in the Lord; refresh my heart in Christ. <sup>21</sup>Confident of your obedience, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I ask. <sup>22</sup>And one thing more: Prepare a guest room for me, because I hope to be restored to you in answer to your prayers.

#### JENKINS CHURCH AND GOD'S WILL

I know that it is easy for some in a busy church like Jenkins to feel we are doing all we can or doing so much, why bring up anything else. But we need to evaluate what we are doing and ask ourselves, "Are we doing what God wants us to do?"

There may be ministries or programs that He wants us to be involved in that we are not and there may be some things that we may not need to be involved in any longer. The need has passed and we keep on trying to keep it going when there is no need. I do know that we are commissioned to make new disciples. We could be more involved in that than we are.

All of this to say: let us begin to look at what God says to us in his word about what his church should be doing. I have been drawn to the words of Jesus. A red-letter edition of the scriptures would help us see these easily. Join me in examining these words. But let us read them in the context of where they were spoken.

I have recently re-read the letters of God's faithful servants, and plan to do it again this fall... just to be reminded of what the church needs to be involved in. Will you join me in this endeavor? And I am and trying to remember to pray more in the spirit of seeking God's will rather than always asking God to help us do what I think.

In late fall and or early winter, we are thinking about getting a group or the whole church together for a series of meetings where we seek to learn God's will for us and seek ways to do what we learn. I hope that you will be interested.

I don't want to be busy with busy work. I want to be busy with God's work.
