# From the Pastor: ATTENDANCE

One determination of the success of a congregation of God's people is ATTENDANCE at the worship services.

One need we have at Jenkins Church is to increase our attendance,,,,, Not to merely show that we are successful, or even to feel good about ourselves, but to have as many people as possible coming together to give glory to God through the various aspects of the worship service. If you are one who has not been to worship in some time, please accept this note as a challenge to you to get back in the habit of worship and to be faithful in your attendance.

Many of you never miss a service. Allow me to challenge YOU to be one who bring un-churched people with you to church. Many people are waiting to be asked. Look around you and seek God's direction in determining who you should invite to come to worship with you.

What can I do for God and His kingdom? Invite an unchurched friend to become a part of God's Kingdom. Begin by inviting them to come to church with you.

With the two services we have sufficient room for many more people.

Let's use this facility to introduce people who do not know Jesus, or who know him but are not presently involved in the work of his church, to come with us and become a believer in him and a worker in building His kingdom.

#### FRIEND DAY

Do any of you remember the FRIEND DAY experiences we had a few years ago? Some of you were first introduced to Jenkins church through FRIEND DAY. Some became active in the Lord's work again after they came back to Church through FRIEND DAY following an extended absence from their former church.

FRIEND DAY is a great way to introduce people to Jenkins church and more importantly, to Jesus.

What is FRIEND DAY???? That is when every active member and constitutient in the church invites someone to come to church with them as their FRIEND on a particular Sunday.

It takes week of preparation to have a successful FRIEND DAY. The preacher takes the lead and invites someone to come as his FRIEND. The ELDERS follow, doing the same. Then the TEACHERS do likewise. And then every MEMBER follows the example of the preceding groups.

Of course, we ask God to direct us to a particular person to invite, we ask God to prepare that person's heart to receive our invitation and to agree to be our FRIEND on that particular Sunday. We ask God to allow nothing to hinder us from being present that Sunday to welcome our FRIEND.

We invite the person to whom God directs us. We pray for him or her. We welcome them when they arrive (and provide transportation if needed) and introduce them to as many people as possible. We take them to our Sunday School Class and we sit by them in worship. And we follow up with a phone call and or letter following the FRIEND DAY and invite them to return.

Have somebody in mind already??? Ask God to confirm it. Keep praying and do the inviting.

WHEN IS FRIEND DAY?????? November 21. That is 8 Sundays away. Plenty of time!!! But none to waste.
