When painting the Last Supper on the wall of the refectory of the Dominican Monastery of Santa Maria delle Grazie in Milan, Leonardo da Vinci faced the challenge of fitting 13 more-than-life-sized figures in a space that measured only 14 by 30 feet. His solution: draw the figures first, and then add the background.

Another artist, Andrea de Castagno, faced a similar problem; however, he opted to conceive the background first and then cram the figures in.

When fitting people into our lives, let's not try to crowd them into our own backgrounds, but instead get to know them and then create a new background.

November 21

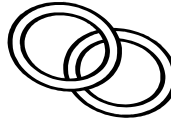
