Attendance

This is a tongue-in-cheek article but may contain some good points. It came about 5 a.m. one morning after a good night's sleep. I called some church members who had not attended worship services in some time and asked them to be with us on Friend Day. They did what I asked and seemed happy that I had called them. That made me to think that maybe, just maybe, we need an attendance police or truant officer for church.

That person or persons would call those who have been absent and invite them back. Carrying this a little further, I began to wonder if I, as pastor, should be the chief officer or if someone in the church would like that job. Or maybe we could find someone outside the church who would do it for us. Maybe the elders could be assistant attendance officers. And maybe the Sunday school teachers could work under them.

I did hear of one church that sent out elders to the absent members' homes with a tape of the previous Sunday's sermon and a tape player. The elders would gather the family together who had been absent and play the tape for them. I don't think that I want to go that far, but maybe we should be more diligent in reaching out to those who are absent from worship for some time.

Do you know some member who has not been present for worship for a Sunday or two or three? Give them a call. They may think that they are not wanted.

Hey, this is not so tongue-in-cheek after all. The more I write the better the idea sounds. Let's do it, but without the truant officers or attendance police (that was the tongue-in-cheek part anyway), but with everybody taking on the responsibility of checking on the absent ones just to let them know that we miss them and want them to be with us when we worship and that Jesus is honored when they gather with fellow Christians to worship him..

Yes, I believe this is a serious article.

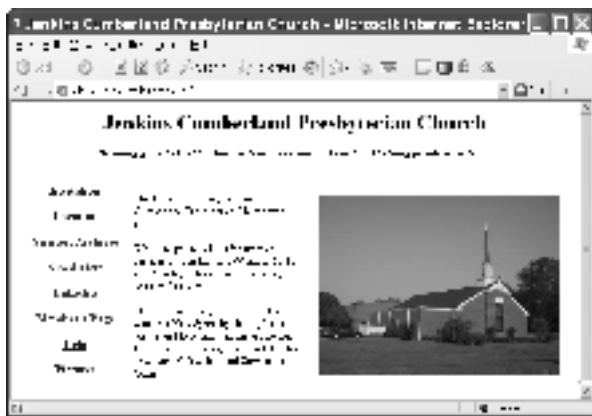
Elder Election
