"I HEARD THE BELLS ON CHRISTMAS DAY"...

Henry Wadsworth Longfellow wrote this hymn on Christmas Day in 1863 for the children of the Sunday School of the Unitarian Church of the Disciples, Boston. The Civil War was at its worst. Six months earlier the Battle of Gettysburg had resulted in 40,000 men killed, wounded, or reported missing in action on both sides. Following a long siege, Vicksburg had been taken by the Union forces and 30,000 Confederate soldiers taken prisoner. In fact, Longfellow's own son Charley, 19 years of age had been wounded in the war about a month before. Longfellow, a recent widower, was caring for his son in their home.

It is not difficult to understand how Longfellow bowed his head in despair and thought, "There is no peace on earth." The poet poured out his soul for peace and goodwill in a very troubled day.

Isn't it moving now days how the "Christ Spirit" or "Holy Spirit" is active in the lives of folk, young and old, in our world, and in our Churches?!

The Birth of Jesus Christ

¹⁸This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

²⁰But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

²²All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: ²³"The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"—which means, "God with us."

²⁴When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. ²⁵But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.
