1The apostles and the brothers throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God. 2So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him 3and said, "You went into the house of uncircumcised men and ate with them."

4Peter began and explained everything to them precisely as it had happened: 5"I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. I saw something like a large sheet being let down from heaven by its four corners, and it came down to where I was. 6I looked into it and saw four-footed animals of the earth, wild beasts, reptiles, and birds of the air. 7Then I heard a voice telling me, 'Get up, Peter. These six brothers also went with me, and we entered the man's house. 13He told us how he had seen an angel appear in his house and say, 'Send to Joppa for Simon who is called Peter. 14He will bring you a message through which you and all your household will be saved.'

15"As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit came on them as he had come on us at the beginning. 16Then I remembered what the Lord had said: 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' 17So if God gave them the same gift as he gave us, who believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I to think that I could oppose God?"

18When they heard this, they had no further objections and praised God, saying, "So then, God has granted even the Gentiles repentance unto life."

THIS WEEK IN CHURCH HISTORY....1810 – February 4th – The Cumberland Presbyterian Church was organized in Dickson County, Tennessee as an outgrowth of the Great Revival of 1800. The founders of the CP church were Finis Ewing, Samuel King, and Samuel McAdow. The Cumberland Presbytery, which was formed at the time the church itself was organized, originally consisted of only these three ministers, but in three years time was sufficiently large enough to form three separate Presbyteries. These three Presbyteries met at the Beech Church in October 1813 to form a Synod, from this Synod a committee was appointed to prepare a Confession of Faith. The next year at Sugg's Creek Church a revision of the Westminster Confession of Faith was presented and was unanimously adopted as the Confession of Faith of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.
