“HOW PRECIOUS, MEMBERSHIP IN THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN”

Matthew 13:44-46

The Kingdom of Heaven is mentioned often in the N.T.

In these two parables Jesus is telling us _____.

In the parable of the treasure the man sells all that he has and buys the field so that he would own the treasure.

In the parable of the pearl the man sells all that he has and buys the pearl.

This is, in essence, what Jesus told the rich young ruler to do. (Luke 18:23)
He refused.

This is what Ananias and Sapphira failed to do. (Acts 5:1-11)

This is what the apostle Paul did.

There is nothing of more value than being a part of the Kingdom of Heaven.

Jesus was saying this in these parables.

Paul was living it in his own life, for himself and for others.

He gave his all to get others into the Kingdom.

But more importantly, Jesus gave His all so that we could be in His Kingdom.

That was them. What about us? Me? You?

Jesus, the pearl of great price, the precious treasure.

MISSIONS & EVANGELISM

Become Thoroughly Equipped:

How can we become equipped to do the work that God has for us? The Bible is clear that a study of God’s Word is essential: 2 Tim 3:16 *All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, 17 So that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work..* (NIV)

God intends for us to place Him front and center in our lives, and to immerse ourselves in His Holy Word: Deuteronomy 6:6 *These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. 7 Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. 8 Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. 9 Write them on the door frames of your houses and on your gates.* (NIV)

Most Christians realize the importance of Bible study, but we sometimes go through periods when our study becomes stale and we spend less time at it. When that happens, God’s ministry through us suffers and our sense of peace and purpose falters. Here are some suggestions that might help re-energize your studies:

1. Pick up a Daily Bread devotional (located in the Narthex and Christian Education Building) and read from it daily.
2. Purchase a good study Bible such as the Life Application Study Bible or the NIV Study Bible. Theologians have studied and prayed for centuries to understand the context and culture behind each word of the Bible. These study notes, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit in your heart, will lead you into exciting new understandings of our awesome God.
3. Make good use of your ride to work via Bible studies or worship music on radio, tape, or CD. WFCM 91.7 FM, 710 AM broadcasts a number of excellent Bible study sermons. (Or just turn the radio off and pray.)
4. Set your VCR to record a sermon. For example, Charles Stanley’s In Touch broadcast can be recorded Sunday morning at 7:00 a.m. on BET.
5. Go shopping! Wander through a Christian Book Store and let God draw you to books, devotionals, Bible studies, etc.
6. Use technology. For example, BibleSoft (www.biblesoft.com) publishes PC Study Bible, which puts volumes of Bible commentaries and Bible translations on your computer at your finger-tips.
7. Join with some others for Bible Study and encouragement (Sunday School, Wednesday night service, women’s Bible study, men’s prayer groupor start a new one!)
