Svetta has a BA in Engineering – Optic – laser Technology, a Master's in New Testament Theology with concentration in music. In addition she is a classical pianist, harpist, plays organ, keyboarder and can sing!! Yaroslav has a BA in Theology, knows chair caning, and is a "jack of all trades". Yaroslav and Svetta are both fluent in English and have served as interpreters and translators. Amili is a charming 2-1/2 year old who seems to be adjusting the best. Be sure to take a moment to "welcome" this family to our community and church family. They have fit in very good with the congregation, always smiling and expressing much appreciation for the opportunity to be in Tennessee and to be of service in the Kingdom of God. FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR THE YATSKY'S

The Yatsky's were able to come to the U.S. because Jenkins church was willing to provide employment for Svetta. The Leonard's asked us to provide the job and they would underwrite the cost. At the initial meeting of the Leonard's with the session, a session member gave a majority of the church's portion of the Social Security tax. The Leonard's have asked others to assist them in paying the salary for Svetta and a number of church families have agreed to help. Other friends of the Yatsky's are also helping. Bob and Becky built an addition to their house where Yaroslav, Svetta and Amelia are living. Some men from Jenkins Church helped with the drywall work there.

A job description for the position created for Svetta includes: playing the organ for worship, playing the piano in Melanie's absence, working with the music program in general in conjunction with the choir director and the pastor, working with children and youth in building the music program of Jenkins Church and other tasks as time and abilities permit. Svetta will officially begin work on September 1st.

BUILDING PROGRESS

As I write this article (Saturday) the framing is being completed and the roof is being installed. We are almost in the dry. In the next few weeks we can expect to see drywall installed and finished, glass doors and windows installed, the present sanctuary back wall removed, a front porch built, stairs, sprinklers and all the rest that makes for a complete building finished.
