¹⁴"Again, it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants and entrusted his property to them. ¹⁵To one he gave five talents of money, to another two talents, and to another one talent, each according to his ability. Then he went on his journey. ¹⁶The man who had received the five talents went at once and put his money to work and gained five more. ¹⁷So also, the one with the two talents gained two more. ¹⁸But the man who had received the one talent went off, dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money.

Sermon Outline September 25, 2005

“Use It or Lose It”

Matthew 25:14-30

Intro: Studying the parables is somewhat like having a message come to us directly from Jesus.

This is a parable about using that with which we have been entrusted.

There is a similar parable in Luke’s gospel.

In this passage I find a challenge to be fruitful and multiply.

(And it is a message concerning the kingdom of heaven.)

Much attention has been given to the one talent man.

Are there more one talent people than 2 or 5 talent people?

Looking at the one talent man we see:

1. He blamed the giver of the talents.
2. He was afraid.
3. Fear –

Some 5 talent and 2 talent people bury their talent too.

My goal is to hear, “well done, ...
