From the Pastor's keyboard:

BRICKS, GUTTERS & LIGHTS

At a called session meeting Tuesday night, September 20th, the session of Jenkins Church voted to go forward with two often discussed projects.

The first, to add 18 lights to the present sanctuary area at a cost of \$3,641.00. Six lights will be added to the choir area to illuminate the music of choir members on the back row of the choir. Six will be added to each side of the area where the people are. This need has been discussed since the sanctuary was built but the need grew and the discussion increased with the addition of the stained glass windows.

The second project, to change the appearance of the north (York Rd.) side of the gymnasium/C.E. building and change the gutter on the north side of that building to an outside gutter. The gymnasium north wall has an inside gutter which has given trouble on numerous occasions and now has a leak in the northeast corner. The roof of this building will be extended to the outside of the building, a new footing will be added the length of the building for the brick and gutters that will be added. The cost is \$36,500.00.

An additional loan of \$30,000.00 has been applied for with the Denominational Board of Stewardship.

This work will fix the gutter problem for many years and cover the metal siding where the oxidation was rubbed off by the trees removed by the tornado in May, 2003.
