## From the Pastor's keyboard:

#### **MERRY CHRISTMAS TO ALL**

Is it "Merry Christmas" or does "happy holidays" do it? I'm for "Merry Christmas".

I don't want to offend anyone, but I do plan to use "Merry Christmas" in my greetings this year, and the next and the next.

In recent weeks we have heard much about clerks at one or more retail outlets being instructed to greet customers during this Christmas season with "happy holidays" rather than the traditional "Merry Christmas".

I understand that the reason behind this action is that our society has become multicultural and many people in our country today do not celebrate Christmas as a time to remember the birth of Jesus, the Christ. The powers that be, not wanting to offend people of a non-Christian tradition and possibly lose their business, made the choice of the "happy holiday" greeting.

How do we respond to this in a Christian manner? Some have chosen to boycott certain stores. Some have signed petitions in protest. I have another suggestion. Any time a store employee greets us with "happy holidays", we can simply reply with, "And a Merry Christmas to you." That way we will be proclaiming our allegiance to Jesus, The Christ, telling all in the sound of our voice that we are celebrating His birth.

This present protest is reminiscent of a similar protest of a few years ago when people were writing the word Christmas by using an X in the place of the word Christ. The charge was made that those who did that were attempting to X Christ out of Christmas. What their goal was I do not know. I do know that there is no way to X Christ out of Christmas, no matter how hard one may try. That is, no one can X Christ out of the REAL Christmas. Without Christ, there is no Christmas. (I am aware that there are many people who have a big celebration of some kind during the Christmas at has nothing to do with Christ). And there is more. The X is one form of the cross, the St. Andrew cross. Christ died on a cross for you and me. Although I am careful to always use the 6 letters, C H R I S T, before the mas, when writing the word Christmas, when I see Xmas, I do remember that Christ died for me and am thankful that he did. Merry Christmas to you all!
