Q: What is Holy Week?

A: Holy Week is the 7 day period at the end of Lent which is the culmination of the entire season. Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday recount for us Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, His Last Supper with His disciples, and His Passion, death and burial before the joy of Christ's resurrection on Easter Sunday.

John 12:20-33 NIV

20Now there were some Greeks among those who went up to worship at the Feast. 21They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, with a request. "Sir," they said, "we would like to see Jesus." 22Philip went to tell Andrew; Andrew and Philip in turn told Jesus.

23Jesus replied, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. 24I tell you the truth, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. 25The man who loves his life will lose it, while the man who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. 26Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves me.

27"Now my heart is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour. 28Father, glorify your name!" Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and will glorify it again." 29The crowd that was there and heard it said it had thundered; others said an angel had spoken to him. 30Jesus said, "This voice was for your benefit, not mine. 31Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out. 32But I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself." 33He said this to show the kind of death he was going to die.

What is the meaning of glorify?

What are we talking about when we speak of GLORIFYING God?

Webster -

Theological word book –

Jesus begins His response to word that some Greeks were looking for Him by saying that, "the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified."

Question: What is Jesus saying will happen to Him or how will He be glorified?

Answer: By His dying.

He illustrates His glorification through death with a seed of grain. He must die in order to be glorified. V. 24, 32, 33.

If we follow Him we must die to self. V. 25

Jesus was disturbed by (or troubled by) what lay ahead for Him.

We are often troubled by what is required of us.

Who will trust Him?
