Today is the celebration of the Ascension of Jesus. He came from heaven to earth that first Christmas. He carried out His saving mission by His suffering and death upon the Cross on Good Friday. He rose victoriously from the dead on Easter Sunday and appeared alive to His disciples and to others for forty days. It was not God's intention for His Son and our Savior to continue indefinitely on this planet earth. The Father's plan was for Jesus to return bodily to heaven and sit at His right hand in His rightful place again. There Jesus would be able to be with all His followers everywhere at once with His invisible presence and be able to intercede for us before the throne of God. We celebrate the Ascension because by it Jesus could keep His promise to us. He said just prior to His Ascension, "Lo, I am with you always, even to the close of the age. After His ascension Jesus fulfilled His promise to send us His Holy Spirit. We will Celebrate Pentecost as a Christian community next Sunday, June 4th because what the Holy Spirit began that first Pentecost, He still continues to do among us yet today.
