Sermon Notes - 07/09/06 Jenkins C.P. Church Nolensville, TN

II Corinthians 12:2-10 - Maybe God Has Different Plan

In our lesson:

The Apostle Paul tells of a vision he had. He didn't understand all about it.

> There is much that we do not understand. Rev. 10 tells about something John saw in his vision and he was told not to write it. There are some things that we do not need to know yet.

There will be a time when we will understand. 2 songs:

No. 544 Charles Tindley "We Shall Understand It By and By". While we await that time, a song by Ira Stamphill has this chorus that is assuring and helpful. "There are things about tomorrow, that I don't seem to understand, But I know who holds tomorrow and I know who holds my hand."

And another song, based on Matt. 6, testifies that "if God's eye is on the sparrow, we can know that he cares for us."

Also in our lesson:

Paul had a thorn in the flesh. Paul wanted God to take the thorn away. That was not God's plan.

God used the thorn. He had a different plan than Paul. What was the thorn? We are not told. This is another time where we don't need to know the details.

The thorn kept Paul humble.

God explained that His grace was sufficient for Paul.
