**Ephesians 4:1-16 NIV**

1As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. 2Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. 3Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. 4There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to one hope when you were called— 5one Lord, one faith, one baptism; 6one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

7But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it.

8This is why it says:

"When he ascended on high, he led captives in his train and gave gifts to men." 9(What does "he ascended" mean except that he also descended to the lower, earthly regions? 10He who descended is the very one who ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe.) 11It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, 12to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up 13until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

14Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of men in their deceitful scheming. 15Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into him who is the Head, that is, Christ. 16From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.

**COLUMBIA PRESBYTERY MISSION TRIP TO  
CHOCTAW PRESBYTERY A SUCCESS IN MORE WAYS  
THAN ONE!**

Sixty-seven youth and adults traveled to southeast Oklahoma on Saturday, July 15<sup>th</sup> to serve the Choctaw Presbytery of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. While we were there we served Choctaw Presbytery by leading the children of McGee Chapel and the Broken Bow community in Vacation Bible School. We had an average of 45 children each day. The children ranged in age from 15 months to 19 yrs. We fell in love with the children. At McGee Chapel we also painted the deck and the front entrance and the handicap ramp. We served the presbytery by working at Camp Israel Folsom. This campground is not only used for the presbyterial camping program, but is used weekly to serve a congregation with weekly worship services. The campground is in much need of repair. Our hope was to complete a cabin for the presbytery to hire a caretaker. Other projects we completed were the playground, fence row, softball field backstop, plumbing, mowing and many other smaller tasks.

It was an eventful trip with many obstacles, but we also had many blessings. It was hot. I mean real hot. But, we were blessed with electricity and air conditioning. Healthy water took on a whole new smell. We bathed with sulfur water, but we had indoor plumbing. We had so much that the Indians of the Choctaw nation did not. We were very blessed and found joy in our blessings.

Worship was a major focus of the mission trip. For without God, this would not be possible. Our theme for worship was God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit's role in our lives. We searched within each of our hearts and found the true meaning for which we were there. No two answers were the same, yet we were all there because God had called us. During worship, several young people privately invited Jesus into their hearts, and several have been baptized or are planning baptisms in their respective churches. We praise God that his work is continuing in the lives of these young people and adults. We pray for their journey and that they will continue to seek God's will for their lives, and their call to whatever ministry God has prepared for them.

I want to thank Jenkins Church for their support for each person that attended the mission trip. I also want to thank Tracy and Kelli Spicer. Without them, this mission trip would not have been the success it was. I also want to thank Pam Cammuse and Jaime Groce. They were my right and left hands. I also want to personally thank each of the following youth and adults that attended from Jenkins: Paul Tucker, John Ball, Andrew Dornan, Jacob Baker, Kerry Mattox, Travis Eckert, Jessica Cammuse, Allie McArthur, Jaelyn Francescon, Nicki Naron, Ann Bomar, Morgan Williams, Tucker Spicer, Braxton Groce and Katy Hartman for all the hard work they did and for the way they represented Jenkins Church and Columbia Presbytery. 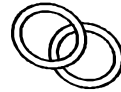
