What's a Christian to Do? Matthew 7:24-27; Deut. 6:6-12, 17-18.

With all the "Do Nots" that a Christian is bombarded with what can a Christian do?

MUCH!

First, look with me at what I have called the obvious.

- Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself. Luke 10:27 (also Matthew 22:36-40 & Mark 12:28-31).
- 2. Forgive those who sin against us. Matthew 6:14-15; (Mark11:25)
- 3. Do to others as you want them to do to you. Luke 6:31.

After the above, the situation becomes difficult, because of the number of things to do and knowing where to begin.

Words of Jesus:

Love enemies, Luke 6:27; Let your light shine, Luke 8:16; Deny self and take up cross and follow Jesus, Luke 9:23; Praise God the Father, Luke10:21; Stay ready, Luke12:35; etc..

Words of the Apostles: Paul And Peter And James And John And the Hebrew writer. And old Testament, too. Suggestion: Read a little bit of the bible every day. (Be careful about certain passages. Compare scripture with scripture. For one example see what Jesus said about "An eye for an eye".)

To obey:

Is the right thing to do, shows one to be a person of the Faith, honors God and Jesus,

And Obey: So that things will go well with you.
