
Ps 139:13 For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. 14 I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. (NIV)

The Bible tells us that we are fearfully and wonderfully made. Those of you in the medical profession probably know that better than any of us. Consider the following statistics which I found on the web (hopefully accurate).

- Our blood is circulated through 60,000 miles of veins, arteries, and capillaries (could circle the world 7 times).
- Every day the heart pumps 5,000 to 6,000 quarts of blood.
- An adult has over 200 separate bones which give us our frame but which also double as an amazing blood manufacturing factory.
- There are more than 600 muscles in a person's body which when combined with our bones and perfectly designed joints give us amazing coordination.
- Our nervous system can zip impulses from the tip of our toes up to the brain and back again, 30 times per second.
- The human brain is the world's most complex computer.

We are fearfully and wonderfully made! Let's watch this short medical animation while you contemplate on how all of the parts of the body come together to give us this fearfully and wonderfully made body. The Bible tells us of another type of fearfully and wonderfully made body with many of the characteristics of our human body. Consider these words from 1 Cor 12:27: 1 Cor 12:27 Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it. (NIV)

Each of us is a member of the Body of Christ.



When we accepted Jesus as our personal Savior, we became custom-made specialized members of His body – the Church. Jesus, who is seated at the right hand of the Father in heaven, is the head of that body. You and I are members of His body here on earth. Consider these words from Romans 12:5-6.



But as a chopped-off finger or cut-off toe we wouldn't amount to much, would we? The paraphrased version of this passage from THE MESSAGE goes like this... Let's just go ahead and be what we were

made to be! What are we made to do in this Body of Christ? Let's look to 1 Peter 4:10.



We are to serve others faithfully. The Bible has a lot to say about service. We are each to have a servant's heart like Jesus. Do you know the test of a servant's heart? How do you respond when someone treats you like one? Sooner or later you will be taken for granted and treated like dirt - like the lowest bond servant – even by those in the church. Use that as an opportunity to glorify God by continuing to obediently serve. Another word for service is ministry. We get scared off by that term but God has an area of ministry, or service, for each one of us. We are to administer God's grace in its various forms. I heard a horrifying statement made by a radio preacher a few months ago. He said that a sad fact of the modern church is that 20% of the members do 80% of the work. If that were true, it would mean that 80% of the members were not performing their ministry within the Body of Christ. If 80% of the parts in our human body were not functioning properly we would either be on life support or we would be dead. I fear that God has many churches on life support for the same reason. Consider the chorus to the song, If We are the Body.




We each have a unique place of service within the Body of Christ and when we don't perform that service, God's grace will not be fully administered through the church. The arms of Jesus will not be reaching, His hands will not be healing, His words will not be teaching, His feet will not be going, His love will not be showing the world the way. Why do we fail to serve within the church? I think it is because we have a wrong notion of service. We think we are not equipped for service and we think that service is an unpleasant task. But we are equipped, and when we obediently serve, we fulfill our purpose for existence, and nothing could be more fulfilling than that. God equips us to serve within the Body of Christ in many ways. Rick Warren captured 5 of them in an acrostic, "SHAPE".







When we are born again through trusting Jesus for salvation, the Holy Spirit comes to live within us. The Holy Spirit wants to manifest His presence within us by working through us to do things which we cannot do on our own. This manifestation of the Holy Spirit in our lives is called a spiritual gift. We don't get a thing called "the gift of teaching" or a thing called "the gift of administration" or so on. Instead, we get the Person of the Holy Spirit, working though each of us in unique ways. There are several lists of spiritual gifts in the Bible and each list is a bit different. This has caused some Bible scholars, such as Billy Graham in his book called the *Holy Spirit*, to suggest that the lists are "for instance" lists and that none of them are all-inclusive. The Holy Spirit may decide to work through you in a totally different way. We are each unique and God works through us in unique ways.





How many unopened gifts do you still have under the Christmas tree? Probably few of us have any. It would be inconsiderate if a loved one of ours carefully picked out just the right gift and offered it to us on Christmas, and we refused to open it. Yet that is exactly what we are prone to do with our Spiritual Gifts. I have been teaching the Sanctuary Sunday School class for a bit over 6 years now but I must confess that the gift of teaching was neatly wrapped up with a bow on it for 30 years from when I was saved at age 16 until I began to teach. Don't leave your gift wrapped up for so long! During that time I spent some time studying spiritual gifts and I took several of those tests that are supposed to tell you your gift. I was frustrated by all of that. I am convinced that the only way to know your gift is to start serving within the Body in different ways. As you obediently serve, God will lead you to the specific areas of service which He has in mind for you, and you will receive confirmation from others within the Body of Christ.




service is something where you grit your teeth and do it, but hate every moment of it. Nothing could be further from the truth. We are commanded to serve the LORD with all our heart. God never gives us a command like that without empowering us to do it. God will give you a passion for specific areas of service. This New Years eve, think about the things that you do where you get so

engaged that you lose track of time. God has an area of service like that for you in the



Our Spiritual Gifts are God-given gifts that we receive at our second birth. We have other God-given abilities that we received at our first birth and which we cultivate throughout our lifetime. These are our natural abilities or talents. Perhaps you are good at building things, good at designing things, good with computers, good at decorating or art or music. All of these Godgiven natural abilities equip you for ministry within the Body of Christ.

1 Cor 12:6 There are



God has given each one of us a unique personality. Our personality is custom made for the work that God has in mind for us.



Here are some of the common dimensions of personality.

Some folks are Extrovert. Their natural focus is on the external world of people and events. Others are Introvert. There natural focus is on the interior world of thoughts and ideas. Each of us falls somewhere between those extremes.

In another dimension, some people are task oriented. Their primary interest is in getting things done. Others are People Oriented. Their primary interest is on cultivating relationships. We each fall between those extremes.

I am down on the lower left side of this grid - a task oriented introvert. You don't have to look too far to find someone who is at the exact opposite corner – a people oriented extrovert (Brother Larry?). Jesus needs each of us in His body. Where do you fall? Does that give you ideas of areas where you should serve?



Finally, God has given each of us a lifetime of experiences. Some of those experiences are great successes. Others are miserable failures. Each of your experiences, perhaps especially the failures, equips you for ministry in the Body of Christ. For example, someone who is recovering from drug or alcohol abuse is well equipped to help others who are suffering with those addictions. All of your past experiences are tools in our Master's hand to be used in the areas of ministry that He has for you.



My challenge to you this New Years Eve, and throughout the New Year, is to evaluate your place with the Body of Christ. Have you opened your spiritual gifts? Are you effectively exercising them? Have you found an area of ministry which you are passionate about? Are you using your

your unique personality, and offered it to the Lord for use in ministry? Are you taking advantage of your lifetime of experiences in your service within the church? Respond to God as we sing the first verse of Have Thine Own Way, Lord (Page 371): Have Thine own way, Lord! Have Thine

own way! Thou art the Potter, I am the clay. Mold me and make me after Thy will, While I am waiting, yielded and still.
