More about Service for the Lord

Jenkins C.P. Church
Matthew 20:20-28

Introduction: In his sermon last Sunday Gary called our attention to the Christian's role as SERVANT. I want us to continue in that line of thinking today. The servant role is the role of the elders, the minister and the person in the pew.

Jesus came to serve and not to be served.

Elders – Make pronouncements and set policy, etc.

This is a part of the job of elder. But there is more.
A greater task is theirs. That task or role is servant.

Jesus set the example of being a servant. John 13.

Paul referred to himself as a servant of Jesus, (Romans, Titus) and of himself and Timothy as servants of Jesus, (Philippians).

Duties in confession.

John 15:15. Jesus said he would no longer call his disciples servants but would now call them friends. Friends serving together.....

Jesus' greatest service was to give Himself as a ransom for us.

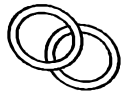
