Who Are Cumberland Presbyterians?

We Cumberland Presbyterians came out of the old Presbyterian Church, February 4, 1810, on the American frontier as a result of differences over theology, ministerial education, methods of ministry, and the Great Revival of 1800. Practically 100 years later, (1906) a union with the Presbyterian Church USA was consummated. The majority of our congregations, institutions missions and ministers conformed to this action. At the time we were the third largest Presbyterian body in the nation.

A sizable minority took action to continue our identity as Cumberland Presbyterians. The Church went through a long period of rebuilding. The denomination, through small, has become a vital, creative, outreaching and loyal steward of its mission. We maintain a program far out of proportion to our size. We hold and insist upon adherence to a high standard of education for our ministers, though careful exemptions are made for practical purposes.

Nehemiah 8:1-12

1 all the people assembled as one man in the square before the Water Gate. They told Ezra the scribe to bring out the Book of the Law of Moses, which the LORD had commanded for Israel. 2 So on the first day of the seventh month Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, which was made up of men and women and all who were able to understand. 3 He read it aloud from daybreak till noon as he faced the square before the Water Gate in the presence of the men, women and others who could understand. And all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law.

4 Ezra the scribe stood on a high wooden platform built for the occasion. Beside him on his right stood {six}*1; and on his left were {seven}*2 5 Ezra opened the book. All the people could see him because he was standing above them; and as he opened it, the people all stood up. 6 Ezra praised the LORD, the great God; and all the people lifted their hands and responded, "Amen! Amen!" Then they bowed down and worshiped the LORD with their faces to the ground.

7 The Levites*3—instructed the people in the Law while the people were standing there. 8 They read from the Book of the Law of God, making it clear and giving the meaning so that the people could understand what was being read.

9 Then Nehemiah the governor, Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who were instructing the people said to them all, "This day is sacred to the LORD your God. Do not mourn or weep." For all the people had been weeping as they listened to the words of the Law.

10 Nehemiah said, "Go and enjoy choice food and sweet drinks, and send some to those who have nothing prepared. This day is sacred to our Lord. Do not grieve, for the joy of the LORD is your strength."

11 The Levites calmed all the people, saying, "Be still, for this is a sacred day. Do not grieve."

12 Then all the people went away to eat and drink, to send portions of food and to celebrate with great joy, because they now understood the words that had been made known to them.
