I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty." 6 Then one of the seraphs flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. 7 With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for." 8 Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us And I said, "Here am I. Send me!" 9 He said, "Go and tell this people" 'Be ever hearing, but never understanding; be ever seeing, but never perceiving.' 10 Make the heart of this people calloused; make their ears dull and close their eyes. Otherwise they might see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their hearts and turn and be healed." 11 Then I said, "For how long, O Lord?" And he answered: "Until the cities lie ruined and without inhabitant, until the houses are left deserted and the fields ruined and ravaged, 12 until the LORD has sent everyone far and the land is utterly forsaken. 13 And though a tenth remains in the land, it will again be laid waste. But as the terebinth and oak leave stumps when they are cut down, so the holy seed will be the stump in the land."

Who Are Cumberland Presbyterians?

We Cumberland Presbyterians came out of the old Presbyterian Church, February 4, 1810, on the American frontier as a result of differences over theology, ministerial education, methods of ministry, and the Great Revival of 1800. Practically 100 years later, (1906) a union with the Presbyterian Church USA was consummated. The majority of our congregations, institutions missions and ministers conformed to this action. At the time we were the third largest Presbyterian body in the nation.

A sizable minority took action to continue our identity as Cumberland Presbyterians. The Church went through a long period of rebuilding. The denomination, through small, has become a vital, creative, outreaching and loyal steward of its mission. We maintain a program far out of proportion to our size. We hold and insist upon adherence to a high standard of education for our ministers, though careful exemptions are made for practical purposes.

Sermon Notes 2/4/2007

More on God's Call to Ministry *Isaiah 6:1-13*

Today is the Cumberland Presbyterian Church's birthday. The Cumberland Presbyterian Church was organized on February 4, 1810. Finis Ewing, Samuel King and Samuel McAdow were the founders.

There were four points of disagreement with the Westminster Confession that the founders could not agree with:

1. That there are no eternal reprobates.
2. That Christ died not for a part only, but for all mankind.
3. That all infants dying in infancy are saved through Christ and the sanctification of the Spirit.
4. That the Spirit of God operates on the world, or as coextensively as Christ has made atonement, in such a manner as to leave all men inexcusable.

The men who formed the church had a burning desire to preach the message of Christ to all who would listen. They went

Could we compare these with the prophet Isaiah? Although he was called by God and sent by God to His people, God warned him that the way would not be easy.

Certainly we can take the problems Isaiah was told that he would face as he fulfilled his calling as warning that there will be difficulties to deal with as we attempt to fulfill our calling.

ATTENDANCE RECORDS

Our attendance for morning worship during January of 2007 has been 156, 175, 161, 148. That compares with 110, 164, 158, 147, 138 for 2006 and 165, 157, 157, 127, 156 for 2005. (Five Sundays in January in '05 and '06). Average attendance for worship in 2004 was 146. It was 147 in 2005 and 138 in 2006.

Sunday School attendance for January 2007 was 78, 71, 84, 70. That compares with 50, 85, 89, 71 for 2006 and 89, 95, 92, 68 for 2005.

What do these figures say? Sunday School attendance is slipping a bit. Worship attendance is up a bit but nothing to brag about. We have much work to do.

Bring a friend, relative, acquaintance or neighbor to church with you. Be friendly to those who are our first time guest. And continue to be friendly and offer a warm welcome when they are here for the sixth or tenth time.

Finances: Total income in 2004 was \$225,674, in 2005 was \$251,101, and in 2006 was \$248,194. Outreach giving: 2004 - \$29,350. 2005 - \$26,693. 2006 - \$36,682. (Denominational, presbyterial, local and other causes outside the local church.)

Who Are Cumberland Presbyterians?

We Cumberland Presbyterians came out of the old Presbyterian Church, February 4, 1810, on the American frontier as a result of differences over theology, ministerial education, methods of ministry, and the Great Revival of 1800. Practically 100 years later, (1906) a union with the Presbyterian Church USA was consummated. The majority of our congregations, institutions missions and ministers conformed to this action. At the time we were the third largest Presbyterian body in the nation.

A sizable minority took action to continue our identity as Cumberland Presbyterians. The Church went through a long period of rebuilding. The denomination, through small, has become a vital, creative, outreaching and loyal steward of its mission. We maintain a program far out of proportion to our size. We hold and insist upon adherence to a high standard of education for our ministers, though careful exemptions are made for practical purposes.
