GENESIS 15:1-12: 17-18 (NIV)

1 After this, the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision: "Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield, your very great reward." 2 But Abram said, "O Sovereign LORD, what can you give me since I remain childless and the one who will inherit my estate is Eliezer of Damascus?" 3 And Abram said, "You have given me no children; so a servant in my household will be my heir." 4 Then the word of the LORD came to him: "This man will not be your heir, but a son coming from your own body will be your heir." 5 He took him outside and said, "Look up at the heavens and count the stars—if indeed you can count them." We visited Popayan, one of the oldest cities in Colombia, and Ramonsa, the poor area where there was a devastating fire last year. We also visited the Colegio American and its satellite schools in Samaria, San Marcos, and Renacir. Forgive me if my spellings of these places are not correct.

Our 13 member group was from 5 states. I also met with Johan Daza, a Colombian seminary student and son of the pastor of the Armenia C P Church, who will join me in April to Guatemala. This will be the first time someone from a country besides the U S has joined The Grace Team on a mission trip.

Boyce has asked me to return in October, and I plan to do so. Please let me know if you are interested, and I will get some dates and more info out as soon as possible. One of our devotions for the week was based on Mathew 6:33, "Seek ye first the kingdom of God" blessings flow when you seek His will for your life. God may be leading you to join us or support in a financial way the work in Colombia or other foreign and local mission work.

The dates for the Casa Shalom trip are April 14-21, 2007. The cost will be around \$1,000. This depends on your plane flight costs, and how much you spend shopping. American, Continental, and Delta all fly direct to Guatemala City (GUA) and Wendy will pick us up at the airport. The orphanage charges \$20 a day, but they cook for us (really good).

I know that God will call those needed for this trip, and I had lots of response since yesterday. We have one who speaks Spanish, and a second maybe, they will help greatly with Bible School, God bless all.
