Becoming a Disciple of Jesus/Getting Saved

Acts 9:1-20: John 21:15-19

Making a decision to follow Jesus and trust Him as Savior and Lord is the MOST important decision we will ever have the opportunity to make. More important than
A decision for Jesus is more far reaching or has more far reaching consequences than any other
decision we will encounter. A decision for Jesus is a decision concerning our eternity.
The apostle Paul's conversion experience, or his decision to follow Jesus, calls our attention to
the differences a decision for Jesus will or can make in a person's life here on earth.
A great change
We first see him
Then we see him
He did not like people who He was on a mission trip
Paul's conversion experience: a light, a voice, a question asked him, an inquiry. Jesus revealed
himself, giving instructions, providing a helper and pointed him in a new direction or gave him a
change of heart. Paul changes fromtoread his letters.
Many people desire to have an experience like that of Paul. Some will be satisfied with nothing
less. But not every experienced of being saved will be like that of Paul. The experience of each
of the 12 was much different than that of Paul and theirs were not all alike. Consider Peter's call
and response.
Mt. 4:18. (Mt 16:13 Affirming his faith in Jesus); Mk. 1:6;
Luke 5:1-11; Jn 1:35-51
Peter's seaside experience with Jesus is about restoration. He had failed miserably.
Lied and denied.
Mt. 26; Mk. 14; Lk. 22; Jn. 18:16
Jesus restores Peter. Jesus gave him the opportunity to re-dedicate his life and he did.
Someone present here today may need restoration.
Where are you? Fighting against Jesus? Fallen away and in need of being restored?
