A Glimpse into Heaven

Revelation 21:1-6 (Rev. 5:11-14; 7:9-17; 21:10-22:5)

Purpose: To call attention to the experience of heaven and invite people to prepare to go there.

Introduction: Song – Holes in the floor of Heaven.

That song is about someone who has died and gone to heaven looking back upon loved one left behind.

This message is about us getting a glimpse of heaven, looking from earth to heaven.

Revelation 21:1-6 (NIV)

1Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. 2I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. 3And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Now the dwelling of God is with men, and he will live with them. They will be His people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. 4He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." 5He who was seated on the throne said, "I am making everything new!" Then He said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true." 6He said to me: "It is done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. To him who is thirsty I will give to drink without cost from the spring of the water of life.

Additional scripture:

Revelation 5:11-14 (New International Version)

11Then I looked and heard the voice of many angels, numbering thousands upon thousands, and ten thousand times ten thousand. They encircled the throne and the living creatures and the elders. 12In a loud voice they sang: "Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and praise!" 13Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and on the sea, and all that is in them, singing: "To Him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be praise and honor and glory and power, for ever and ever!" 14The four living creatures said, "Amen," and the elders fell down and worshiped.

Revelation 7:9-17 (NIV) The Great Multitude in White Robes

9After this I looked and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. 10And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb." 11All the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They fell down on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, 12saying: "Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!" 13Then one of the elders asked me, "These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?" 14I answered, "Sir, you know." And he said, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. 15Therefore, "they are before the throne of God and serve Him day and night in His temple; and He who sits on the throne will spread His tent over them. 16Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst. The sun will not beat upon them, nor any scorching heat. 17For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd; He will lead them to springs of living water. And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

Revelation 21:10-22:5 (NIV)

10And he carried me away in the Spirit to a mountain great and high, and showed me the Holy City, Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God. 11It shone with the glory of God, and its brilliance was like that of a very precious jewel, like a jasper, clear as crystal. 12It had a great, high wall with twelve gates, and with twelve angels at the gates. On the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of Israel. 13There were three gates on the east, three on the north, three on the south and three on the west. 14The wall of the city had twelve foundations, and on them were the names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb. 15The angel who talked with me had a measuring rod of gold to measure the city, its gates and its walls. 16The city was laid out like a square, as long as it was wide. He measured the city with the rod and found it to be 12,000 stadia in length, and as wide and high as it is long. 17He measured its wall and it was 144 cubits thick, by man's measurement, which the angel was using. 18The wall was made of jasper, and the city of pure gold, as pure as glass. 19The foundations of the city walls were decorated with every kind of precious stone. The first foundation was jasper, the second sapphire, the third chalcedony, the fourth emerald, 20the fifth sardonyx, the sixth carnelian, the seventh chrysolite, the eighth beryl, the ninth topaz, the tenth chrysoprase, the eleventh jacinth, and the twelfth amethyst. 21The twelve gates were twelve pearls, each gate made of a single pearl. The great street of the city was of pure gold, like transparent glass. 22I did not see a temple in the city, because the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple. 23The city does not need the sun or the moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and the Lamb is its lamp. 24The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their splendor into it. 25On no day will its gates ever be shut, for there will be no night there. 26The glory and honor of the nations will be brought into it. 27Nothing impure will ever enter it, nor will anyone who does what is shameful or deceitful, but only those whose names are written in the Lamb's book of life.

Revelation 22 The River of Life

1Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, as clear as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb 2down the middle of the great street of the city. On each side of the river stood the tree of life, bearing twelve crops of fruit, yielding its fruit every month. And the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. 3No longer will there be any curse. The throne of God and of the Lamb will be in the city, and his servants will serve Him. 4They will see His face, and His name will be on their foreheads. 5There will be no more night. They will not need the light of a lamp or the light of the sun, for the Lord God will give them light. And they will reign for ever and ever.

From the Pastor:

Commandment plus Commission

There are two subjects that the church must ever keep before herself: the great commandments and the great commission.

The greatest commandment is to love God with our all and the second greatest commandment is to love our neighbor as we love ourselves. The great commission is to go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.

Both the commandments and the Commission are words from Jesus.

How are we doing at keeping his word? He is our Lord as well as our Savior.

One might say that Jesus commands that we love God and our neighbor and that He demands that we share His love with the world so that the people of the world might become His disciples, and because He tells us to do this we who are His subjects are obligated to do what He says. That is very true.

But there is another reason for fulfilling or obeying His great commandments and His great commission. He has saved us, redeemed us. He has done for us what we could not do for ourselves. He paid for our sin when he died on the cross. And He loved us while we were still sinners. Because He loved us He provided a way for us to go to heaven. That way is by trusting in what He did for us on the cross. He died in our place.

So because He orders or commands us to love God our neighbor and go to all people and make disciples of them, let us do it. But also to show our appreciation for what He had done for us let us be actively loving and sharing the good news of Jesus.

That is outreach. That is missionary work. That is obeying Jesus.

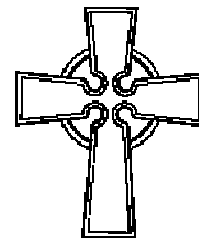

The Cumberland Presbyterian has an official logo . . . The 2006 General Assembly adopted this symbol as one way of showing the world what "Cumberland Presbyterian" means.

This design illustrates the people of God becoming the Body of Christ in the world. It intentionally looks like a Celtic cross. It is unique, however; in the fact that the cross is composed of **four people** forming a circle. This illustrates the church as being the Body of Christ, and that the Cumberland Presbyterians are a connective community. Although the people appear to be closing inward to the circle, the cross as a whole projects outward. The people of God form a great **circle**. This is a circle of God's love and grace; like a wedding band, the kind that has no end, one that can never be broken. The circle also represents the world into which the church brings God's love and grace. Looking deeper, the white space inside the circle possesses another cross made of **four cups**. This represents our bringing the Cup of Salvation to the four corners of the earth. Ultimately the design resembles a cross. But it does just that, resembles a cross. We are always being transformed into the likeness of Christ, our Lord.
