Acts 14:8-18(NIV)

8In Lystra there sat a man crippled in his feet, who was lame from birth and had never walked.
9He listened to Paul as he was speaking. Paul looked directly at him, saw that he had faith to be healed
10and called out, "Stand up on your feet!" At that, the man jumped up and began to walk.
11When the crowd saw what Paul had done, they shouted in the Lycaonian language, "The gods have come down to us in human form!"
12Barnabas they called Zeus, and Paul they called Hermes because he was the chief speaker.
13The priest of Zeus, whose temple was just outside the city, brought bulls and wreaths to the city gates because he and the crowd wanted to offer sacrifices to them.
14But when the apostles Barnabas and Paul heard of this, they tore their clothes and rushed out into the crowd, shouting:
15"Men, why are you doing this? We too are only men, human like you. We are bringing you good news, telling you to turn from these worthless things to the living God, who made heaven and earth and sea and everything in them.
16In the past, He let all nations go their own way.
17Yet He has not left Himself without testimony: He has shown kindness by giving you rain from heaven and crops in their seasons; He provides you with plenty of food and fills your hearts with joy."
18Even with these words, they had difficulty keeping the crowd from sacrificing to them.

Exodus 20:3(NIV) You shall have no other gods before me.

No god Except God

Purpose: Educational. To review the power of God to heal and warn against making gods out of the ordinary.

Historical setting: Paul and Barnabas are engaged in their mission of central Asia Minor. Driven out of Pisidian Antioch they go to Iconium and meet resistance there. Today's Lesson is about their experience in Lystra.

This scripture is an account of a physical healing, the reaction to that healing and the response of Paul and Barnabas to that reaction.

Paul was preaching. This passage does not specifically say, but his other preaching would indicate that he preached Jesus and Him crucified. Also, very possible he preached about healing power of Jesus.

Paul saw a crippled man in the audience who Paul perceived had faith to be healed. Paul called for the man to stand and he did and also leaped and walked.

The people thought Paul and Barnabas were gods.

Paul and Barnabas resisted being elevated to divine status.
V. 14, 15a.

They urged the pagan population to turn away from vain things. v. 15

They called on them to recognize God as creator. V. 15
They reminded them that God had been present in their midst all along. V. 17.

Invitation: To commit to worshipping and serving God and Him only.
To trust Jesus as your Lord and Savior.

and faithful instruction is on her tongue.
- 27 She watches over the affairs of her household
and does not eat the bread of idleness.
- 28 Her children arise and call her blessed;
her husband also, and he praises her:
- 29 "Many women do noble things,
