Romans 7:14-25 (NIV)

14We know that the law is spiritual; but I am unspiritual, sold as a slave to sin. 15I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. 16And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. 17As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me. 18I know that nothing good lives in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. 19For what I do is not the good I want to do; no, the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing. 20Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin living in me that does it. 21So I find this law at work: When I want to do good, evil is right there with me. 22For in my inner being I delight in God's law; 23but I see another law at work in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within my members. 24What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? 25Thanks be to God—through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself in my mind am a slave to God's law, but in the sinful nature a slave to the law of sin.

1John 1:5-10 (NIV)

5This is the message we have heard from Him and declare to you: God is light; in Him there is no darkness at all. 6If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth. 7But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, His Son, purifies us from all sin. 8If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. 9If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. 10If we claim we have not sinned, we make Him out to be a liar and His word has no place in our lives.

LEADER: The Word of God for the People of God.

PEOPLE: Thanks be to God.

What is a Christian to do When He/She Sins?

Purpose: To inform or remind the Christian how to deal with sin.

Introduction: When you became a disciple of Jesus you were not exempt from sinning. The Apostle John spoke it rather emphatically. See I John 1:8, 10.

The Apostle Paul described the situation of his life --- the very same situation most, if not all Christians find themselves in. Romans 7: 14-25.

(We must be careful that we do not interpret this as a license to or encouragement to sin. Romans 6: 1-2. Here Paul was writing about when sin increased, grace abounded all the more. Rm. 5:20)

What to do when we sin;

Confess - I John 1:9

Return to the Lord - Isaiah 55:7

Sorrow over our sin - Psalm 51:17

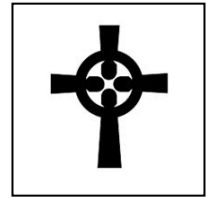
Realize we have an advocate with the Father - I John 2:1
