Romans 12:1-5(NIV)

1Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God—this is your spiritual act of worship. 2Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will. 3For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you. 4Just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, 5so in Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.

Romans 12:9-21 9Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. 10Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves. 11Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. 12Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. 13Share with God's people who are in need. Practice hospitality. 14Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. 15Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn. 16Live in harmony with one another. Do not be proud, but be willing to associate with people of low position. Do not be conceited. 17Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everybody. 18If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. 19Do not take revenge, my friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord. 20On the contrary: "If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink. In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head." 21Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Maturing in Christ Through Fellowship

Romans 12

Purpose: to express the importance of fellowship in the community of faith – church.

Introduction: Do we fellowship too much?
What is fellowship?

Some people in the church do not want fellowship. One man I knew long ago...

Fellowship was an important part of the first century church. Some examples:

Fellowship was/is important in the Jewish community.

Church fellowship has been important in every generation.

Jesus often participated in fellowship activities: Home of Mary, Martha and Lazarus;

home of Zacchaeus (Luke 19);

feeding 5000 and 4000, etc .

Fellowship is not always associated with a meal. Or food and drink.

Example of failure in making guest feel welcome.

Romans 12 tell us how to have fellowship:

Love one another v. 9-10

Honor one another v. 10

Worship with one another v. 11-12

Be gracious v. 13

Practice empathy v. 15

Get along, be humble, don't get even v. 14-20

Be honest v. 17 b

Be good v. 21
