FINANCE UPDATE

I would like to take this opportunity to bring the Church up to date on our current mortgage situation.

As you know, we have two mortgages. The first mortgage is the one we got to do the narthex. Currently, our balance is \$323,910.68. We pay \$2,046.07 a month and our rate is 5%.

Our second loan was for the bricking of the gymnasium building. Our current balance is \$22,095.91. We pay \$594.94 a month and our rate is 7%.

I would like for us to concentrate on the smaller loan and try to pay it off as fast as possible. We would then be able to pay more on the larger loan.

I would encourage the members of our Church to pray concerning what part each might play towards this effort.
