

From the preacher Honoring God

I want to share with you who read this some thoughts that I had recently about our commitment to God. It is my hope that this will be a challenge to all of us. As the thoughts came to me, I wrote them down and then later read them for myself. They challenged me to draw nearer to God and to do more to honor and glorify Him.

Question One: How serious are you about your relationship with God?

Question Two: How devoted, committed and/or dedicated are you to God and the work of His kingdom?

Question Three: What do you see as the value of God in you life (of having a close relationship with God)?

Question Four: What does your participation in the life of Christ body, the church, and reveal about your relationship with God?

These are just some thoughts that came to me. Just maybe they were sent to me by God Himself as I try to be a good pastor and be obedient to Him.

There are many ways to serve God and His Son, our Savior, Jesus. Probably no way is better in today's world than when we meet with other believers and worship Him.

We can meet God anywhere and worship Him anywhere. I have been told many times of the places we can meet Him and worship Him. I agree with them all. God is everywhere. But do we worship Him when we are in these other places and have not gone there for the particular purpose of worshipping Him?

And remember that other people need your encouragement and support when they come to God's house to worship Him, even if you don't feel that you need them.

Here's hoping to be with you in worship.

Emphasizing Evangelism

With an emphasis on evangelism in our denomination I have been thinking about the ways to evangelize or examples of evangelizing that are found in the New Testament.

The example of John the Baptist calling people to God is recorded in Matthew 3. In Matthew 4 we find that Jesus began to preach, calling people to, "turn from sin and turn to God, for the Kingdom of heaven is near." In the same chapter we read that Jesus invited Peter and Andrew, who were fishermen, to come with Him. He promised to show them how to fish for the souls of men.

In Matthew 5 Jesus talks to a crowd of people and tells them that they are the flavoring or seasoning for the world. Is flavoring the world evangelizing? I believe that it is.

Jesus said to the crowd, "you are the world's light, glowing in the night for all to see. Let your light shine for all. Let your good deeds glow for all to see, so that they will praise your heavenly father." Isn't that evangelizing, too?

And this is just the beginning. There are 23 more chapters in Mathew and 26 more books in the New Testament to find examples of evangelism. Look them up. Make a list and pass it on to me.
