Luke 14: 15 - 24

15When one of those at the table with him heard this, he said to Jesus, "Blessed is the man who will eat at the feast in the kingdom of God." 16Jesus replied: "A certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. 17At the time of the banquet he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited, Come, for everything is now ready.'

18"But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said, 'I have just bought a field, and I must go and see it. Please excuse me.' 19"Another said, 'I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me.' 20"Still another said, 'I just got married, so I can't come.'

21"The servant came back and reported this to his master. Then the owner of the house became angry and ordered his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame.' 22" 'Sir,' the servant said, 'what you ordered has been done, but there is still room.' 23"Then the master told his servant, 'Go out to the roads and country lanes and make them come in, so that my house will be full. 24I tell you, not one of those men who were invited will get a taste of my banquet.' "

Sermon Outline: (Luke 14:15-24 & Luke 4:28-30)

Come To The Banquet

It all started on a Sabbath ---

Jesus was having a meal ---

He was being watched. He was not among friends.

He had offended some synagogue leaders back in His hometown. A man with dropsy was present.

Jesus asked if He would be breaking the law if He healed the man that day. (Sabbath)

No answer. He healed the man. He gives the "Ox In The Ditch" lesson. Silence.

He (Jesus) observed how people chose their seats and told them how they should do it.

He gave a lesson on who God's people should invite to a meal. And why.

Finally one of the guest spoke up saying, "blessed is he who will eat at the feast in the Kingdom of God." (A long expected feast when God broke into history.)

Jesus replied with the parable about inviting people into God's Kingdom.

1. Host – Master. Represents God.
2. People who made excuses – people Jesus was eating with and talking to. Pharisees Jesus was trying to show what a great opportunity they were passing up.
3. The servants – Jesus and those he calls to help Him bring people into the kingdom. Servants – plural
4. Those who came - They may not be the ones we had hoped for.
5. More room for others – Heaven is big – go to where people are.

Conclusion: If people get invited to the Banquet of God it will very likely be through the local church and by a layperson.
