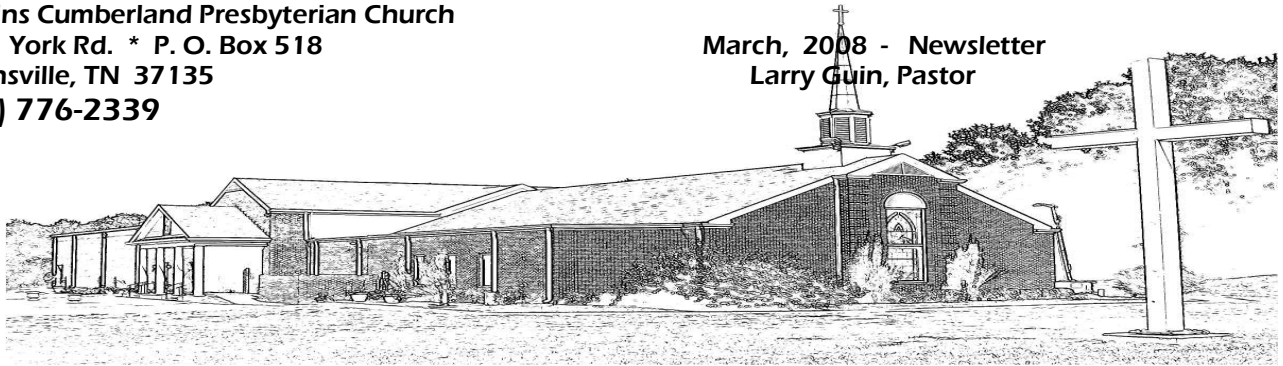

Pastoral Pondering

STATISTICS FROM 2007:

Total membership at the end of 2007 – 289 (same as 2006); gains in membership -5; loses – 5; 3 children were baptized; 143 active members at the end of 2007 (146 in 2006). There was one profession of faith in 2007; 104 are enrolled in Sunday School. Total income received in 2007 was \$254,841. \$33,081 of the \$254,841 was given to causes outside the local church. The church property is valued at \$2,391,000.00.

GETTING OR GIVING:

What did you get? This is a question often asked after a birthday, anniversary or Christmas. Many people come to church expecting to get something. I have heard many people say about their experience at church, “I didn’t get anything out of it.” Many people justify, or try to justify, their dropping out of God’s work by saying, “I wasn’t getting anything out of it.”

But is GETTING our primary need when we come to church? The Christians have already gotten. Yes, the people who trust Jesus as their Lord and Savior have already received far beyond their ability to measure. The Christians have ALREADY received: salvation, forgiveness from sin, eternal life, the presence of Jesus with them (us), the company of the Holy Spirit, the guidance of the Holy Spirit, abundant life, help in time of need, fellowship with God the Father (the one who made us, our creator) and Jesus the Son, help in understanding the Bible (God’s message to us), a home prepared for us in heaven, light to get us through this world, ...?. Think about it!

Now, use this time at church to worship the GIVER of EVERY GOOD GIFT that you have already RECEIVED and share with others and with God how thankful you are for what you have already RECEIVED. Rejoice with fellow Christians (recipients) over the blessings God has poured into your lap. Give something of yourself back to God. In the gospel of Luke, 6:38, Jesus tells us to, “Give and it will be given to you. You will have more than enough. It can be pushed down and shaken together and it will still run over as it is given to you. The way you give to others is the way you will receive in return.” (New Life Version) Give of your time, energy, voice resources, attention, love compassion, self.

Years before Jesus came God spoke to the Israelites through Malachi in the book of Malachi, 3:10. – Bring the tenth part into the store-house, so that there may be food in My house. Test Me in this, “says the Lord of All. “See if I will not then open the windows of heaven and pour out good

things for you until there is no more need.

CORRECTION: In the February newsletter the budget need for each week was incorrect. The correct amount is \$4,496. The building debt retirement need is \$612. per week. We have not met the budget in 2008.

FROM OUR TREASURER

Now that we have two months of the new year behind us, I need to report to the congregation how our giving compares to our budget.

First, let me say that in 2007, our budget, excluding the building fund was \$222,196.00 or \$4,273.00 a week.

Our budget for 2008, excluding the building fund, is \$233,801.00 or \$4,496.00 a week. The increase of the budget is \$11,605.00 for the year. Of this, \$4,500.00 is projected for gas costs and \$5,100.00, is projected for replacement for heating/air units.

In January, the giving was \$14,235.00 or \$3,558.00 a week. The shortfall was \$938.00 a week or \$3,558.00 for the month.

Our February offering was \$13,549.00 or \$3,387.00 a week. The shortfall for the month was \$4,435.00 or \$1,108.00 a week.

If we can, we need to do better, and that is why I thought the congregation should know where we stand!

On a happier note, let me tell you that our mortgage as of January 14th, 2008, stands at \$319,466.70. Our 2nd mortgage, however, stands at \$3,389.07 as of January 15th, 2008. On February 4th I sent the regular payment of \$594.04 and a principal only payment of \$1,396.36. Our unpaid balance should be down to near \$1,500.00. We'll be done with this shortly.
