MOTHER'S DAY

Throughout the ages, mothers have held an esteemed position comparable to queens, saints and flags of nations. Poets and musicians have vocalized the virtues of mothers and motherhood through sonnets and songs.

An old historic church in the north central section of West Virginia is perpetually maintained as an elegant, sacred shrine to all mothers everywhere, living and dead. Many people know of the church, and also that Miss Ann M. Jarvis was the founder of Mother's Day, and that the first authorized Mother's Day service was held at this same Andrews Methodist Church in Grafton, W. Va. The first sermon preached for Mother's Day was on May 10, 1908.

Inspired by the life and work of her mother, Mrs. Anna R. Jarvis, Miss Jarvis persisted in her efforts to establish a day honoring her mother and all mothers. She persuaded friends to have a service May 12, 1907, in Andrews Church to her mother, who had taught and worked in that church for many years prior to her death in 1905. Organizing a national Mother's day committee, which included H.J. Heinz of Pittsburgh and John Wanamaker of Philadelphia, Miss Jarvis drafted plans for a day in 1908 when all mothers would be exalted.

At Miss Jarvis' urging, Sunday morning, May 10, 1908 was set aside at Andrews Church for such an observance. Following a special Sunday School service, directed by superintendent L.L. Loar, church members and friends went upstairs to the sanctuary for a Mother's Day church service. The minister, the late Dr. Harry C. Howard, used the text of Christ's words from the cross, "Woman, behold thy son! Then said He to the disciple, Behold your mother!" for a sermon extolling mothers.

That morning 500 white carnations, sent by Miss Jarvis from Philadelphia, were distributed. Miss Jarvis declared one of the purposes of a special day honoring mothers was "to create a bond of brotherhood through the wearing of a floral badge, the white carnation" (her mother's favorite flower). At the service, the congregation passed a resolution setting aside the second Sunday of May each year as Mother's Day.

President Woodrow Wilson, in 1914, signed a resolution designating the second Sunday of May each year as Mother's day.

Such wide acceptance of the idea surprised the preacher of the first authorized service, as he confessed years later. "It didn't occur to me at the time, that Mother's Day would become first a statewide and then a national event."
