Words to Build On

Matthew 7:21:17

There are things that catch my mind and won't let go. You probably have had similar experiences. Think about it!

This week for me it was the phrase in Matthew 7:24 and 26: "these words of mine" or "these sayings of mine." Words of Jesus, also found in Luke 6:47.

When preaching on Matt 7:24 ff. I have not gotten into the words of Jesus that He said we could build a life that would withstand storms of life. I have mainly merely referred you to the words in red.

A step further today. I have printed the words attributed to Jesus in Matt. 4,5,6,7. These are not all of His words, but a good start. We cannot cover all of these in one sermon, but can hit some high points.

From Ch. 4. Jesus ridding himself of Satan.

Ch. 5:13-16 Salt and light

Ch. 5: 17-20 Jesus and O.T. Law.

Ch. 5:21 ff Relationships, making an offering, settling arguments, lust, love for enemies.

Ch. 6 Showoffs, Forgiveness is essential, Trust in God alone,

Ch. 7 Common sense behind right behavior.

Living, not professing, is what matters.

Still only a beginning, but a good beginning. And we must start somewhere.

Are we following what Jesus teaches?

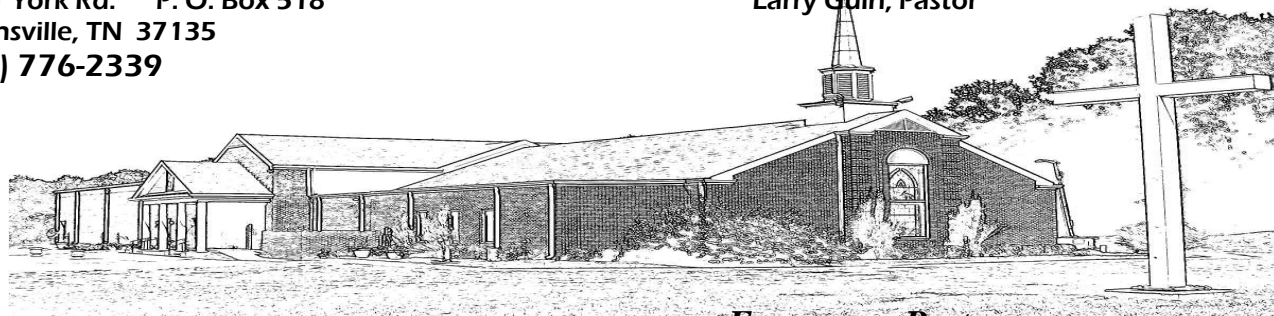
