**Philippians 2:1-18**

1 If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, 2 then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose. 3 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. 4 Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. 5 Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: 6 Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, 7 but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. 8 And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death— even death on a cross! 9 Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, 10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. 12 Therefore, my dear friends, as you have always obeyed—not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence—continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, 13 for it is God who works in you to will and to act according to his good purpose. 14 Do everything without complaining or arguing, 15 so that you may become blameless and pure, children of God without fault in a crooked and depraved generation, in which you shine like stars in the universe 16 as you hold out the word of life—in order that I may boast on the day of Christ that I did not run or labor for nothing. 17 But even if I am being poured out like a drink offering on the sacrifice and service coming from your faith, I am glad and rejoice with all of you. 18 So you too should be glad and rejoice with me.

If Knowing Jesus Means Anything To You ...Philippians 1:1-18

The Apostle Paul wrote many letters to churches.

He was instructing the members of the churches about Jesus, church life and how they were to live in this New Life. Many came to Christ from Judaism and many came from pagan lifestyles.

Back in the letter to the Romans, Paul urges the Christians (Kingdom people) who read the letter to present their bodies as living sacrifices to God in response to God's mercies extended to them (us). 5 Chapters. Rm. 12-16.

A similar urging is sent to the Christians at Philippi.

To the Philippians members of God's kingdom, Paul says, in effect, that if your relationship with Jesus means anything to you, you need to live in a certain way (or you have responsibilities to fulfill).

The church at Philippi was a great church....

But Paul is concerned that the people will be discouraged by persecution(he faced persecution in Philippi), and that they will divide into factions.

He calls for unity....He calls for standing firm.....He calls for people helping other people.

And then he says that Philippians (Christians) should have the same attitude as Jesus had.

Paul leaves no doubt what the attitude of Jesus was. Philippians 2:5-11. Let's read that.

V. 12 begins with THEREFORE. Since Jesus did this for you ..... v. 12, 13. v. 14-16.

But actually the instructions for Christian living begin in Ch. 1, v. 27..And continues through v 30.

How are you doing in your living as a member of the Kingdom of God. Are you making any sacrifices for the Kingdom? Do you need to? Do you need to talk about your situation here at the kneeling bench among God's people? Or maybe, just maybe, your need is to trust Jesus as your Savior and Lord and make that confession to the Glory of God the Father.
