Jesus' Authority

Mark 1:21-28

Jesus came to save us from our sin. He used His miracle working power to save one person.

First Miracle of Jesus. Only in John. Ch. 2

Mark and Luke both write about Jesus driving an evil (unclean) spirit our a man -- The first miracle they tell us about. This happened just as he began his ministry in Capernaum.

Mark relates that Jesus went to Capernaum and went into the synagogue and began to teach.

The people were amazed at his teaching. He taught with authority.

But teaching wasn't all that took place there.

The man began yelling at Jesus. The man had an evil spirit or spirits.

They recognized Jesus. Jesus stopped the man (spirit) from speaking. He called the spirit out of the man. Spirit convulsed the man.

Jesus exercised His authority. He has authority over evil. Representation of evil understands that.

Dealing with evil (sin).

News spread about Jesus' power (authority).

Our job is spreading the news of Jesus.

Jesus' work made an impression on the people who saw it.

A changed life will make an impression.
