Mark 4:35-41

³⁵ That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side." ³⁶ Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. ³⁷ A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. ³⁸ Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" ³⁹ He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. ⁴⁰ He said to his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?" ⁴¹ They were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"

Waking Up Jesus

Mark 4:35-41

What does this experience of Jesus and the disciples have to do with us? Jesus in a boat with the disciples, going from one side of the lake, sea of Galilee, where he had been teaching a large crowd, using parables, to the other side where he would encounter a man with an evil spirit, which he cast out of the man.

Let's look at it.

Jesus taking a nap. A windstorm or serious squall came up. The disciples were fearful. They awaken Jesus. They ask Him if He does not care about them being in danger of drowning. He calms the storm. He asks them about their faith, or lack of it. They are afraid, or stand in awe, and ask each other who this Jesus is.

I understand that the really important thing that the disciples did was to wake up Jesus.
