¹⁷ he had to be made like his brothers in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. ¹⁸ Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.

4:15 For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet was without sin.

7:26-28 Such a high priest meets our need—one who is holy, blameless, pure, set apart from sinners, exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he does not need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for the sins of the people. He sacrificed for their sins once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests men who are weak; but the oath, which came after the law, appointed the Son, who has been made perfect forever.

1 Peter 2:22-25;

²² "He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth." ²³ When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. ²⁴ He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. ²⁵ For you were like sheep going astray, but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

Many things we know about Jesus.

Teacher, healer, miracle worker, etc.

His most important work is that of SAVIOR. His own words in Luke 19:10: For the Son of man is come to **seek** and to **save** that which was lost.

The Problem: Man sinned. The result of that sin: Alienation from God.

Many passages of scripture that tell us of Jesus being our Savior: Rom. 5:6-11; 8:1-4; Eph. 1:3-10; 1 Pet. 1:3-9; 2: 21-25; 1 Jn. 4:9-10. (plus many more).

Being alienated from God, He acted to reconcile us to Himself.

He sent His reconciling love through Jesus.

Through Jesus sins are forgiven.

Jesus: truly human-truly divine.

Tempted to sin, yet resisted.

Suffered sin and death for all, raised from death, ascended, makes intercession

Holy spirit call us to faith and sustains us.
