"About Communion (The Lords Supper)"

1 Cor. 11:23-26

Holy Communion is one of the two sacraments of the protestant church.
A sacrament...

Jesus Christ ordained the sacraments of baptism and the Lord's Supper for the church.

Names attached to Holy Communion: The Lord's Supper, The Last Supper.
Eucharist...

The Lord's Supper was instituted by Jesus Christ.

It is a means by which the church remembers and shows forth Christ's passion and death on the cross.

The elements: bread and the fruit of the vine representing the body and blood of Christ.

The elements are never to be worshiped. They are never anything other than bread and the fruit of the vine.

Representing the Savior's passion and death, this sacrament should not be received without due self-examination, reverence, humility, and grateful awareness of Christ's presence. 1 Cor. 11:27

A means of spiritual nourishment and growth.

An act of grateful obedience to Christ / a commitment to the work and service of His church.

All persons who are part of the covenant community and are committed to the Christian life are invited and encouraged to receive this sacrament.

This sacrament should be: celebrated regularly/received frequently.

Remember those who are homebound or in Nursing Homes, ill and in pain. Pray for our troops as they serve around the world. Pray that God will safeguard them and provide for their needs, whether physical, spiritual or emotional. Pray for peace for the Cumberland Presbyterian Churches in Buenaventura, Columbia, South America. (Church Bombings)
