²⁷ Some of the Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, came to Jesus with a question. ²⁸ "Teacher," they said, "Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies and leaves a wife but no children, the man must marry the widow and raise up offspring for his brother. ²⁹ Now there were seven brothers. The first one married a woman and died childless. ³⁰ The second ³¹ and then the third married her, and in the same way the seven died, leaving no children. ³² Finally, the woman died too. ³³ Now then, at the resurrection whose wife will she be, since the seven were married to her?"



Sunday afternoon at the Popayan Church (Sam Suddarth spoke), Tuesday evening, (Patrick preached) Thursday evening was a Thanksgiving service (Rev. Dr. James Cantey delivered a message) Pastor Jhonny Montano delivered a challenge to the congregation to step up and keep the project on track. They gave us many gifts of appreciation, and many hugs and kisses, and lots of tears for our departure on Friday.

Building relationships is a major part of the work of the Grace Team. I felt that being the first group to go to Popayan we should try especially hard to accomplish this. What a success!!!!!! We all left a little of ourselves there and took a part of them with us.
