We will meet for worship at 6:30 and then split up into our two different small groups. Debbie Hatfield teaches the Jr. High and Patrick teaches the Sr. High.



### **Elders Retreat at Crystal Springs Camp**

Recently, our pastor, youth pastor, session clerk and elders attended an elders retreat. The emphasis for this retreat was on Leadership. We used a church leadership development kit from The Right Now Leadership Conference entitled, The Mission of the Church Matters.

Friday night we watched a DVD by pastor, Francis Chan, author of the book Crazy Love. (I do suggest this book for your reading list) Francis and his wife founded Cornerstone Church in Simi Valley, California in 1994. Francis spoke about the cost of leadership and the need to be completely surrendered and sold out to Jesus. We were all deeply impacted by his message and it set the tone for the retreat. Throughout the retreat Patrick led us in times of devotion with scripture and mini DVD clips that delivered powerful truths to support and prod our thinking about leadership.

Saturday morning our DVD selection was Tim Ross, Young Adult Pastor for The Potter's House Church in Dallas Texas where T.D. Jakes is Senior Pastor. Tim described the essentials for leadership by exploring Philippians 3. He spoke about Paul saying, "If you want to be like Jesus, follow me." He challenged us as leaders to be able to say the same thing to our congregation. Live and lead in such a way that if people follow you they will see the example of Christ. Tim talked about being a leader who is H.O.T. Honest, Open, and Transparent.

I have attended many conferences, and I have learned when you are having a lot of information thrown at you in a short period of time, at best, you can only hope to come away from the event with maybe two significant revelations that will transform your thinking and hopefully your ministry. These three letters and the words they represent was one of those revelations. Since this retreat, during our meetings and other church events, we are talking about the need, as leaders of this congregation, to be honest, open and transparent. Pray for us as we lead, as God is molding and shaping us to lead more effectively.

George Barna, author of 41 bestselling books, and founder of the Barna Group, which he helped to become the leading marketing research firm in America, was the final DVD speaker we listened to on Saturday. He graduated from Boston College summa cum laude, masters from Rutgers, and a doctorate from Dallas Baptist University. George is one of those brilliant minds who also got hold of the wisdom of God. During his presentation George gave us six checkpoints in understanding the qualities of and effective leader. He had researched the lives of 30 effective leaders to arrive at these six checkpoints. Checkpoint #2 stated, "Nobody is the complete leadership package – so it is important to work as a team." A team can always achieve more than the individual. #3, Listening is the skill that most needs development in a leader. #5, Success is helping people achieve their potential. #6, Do not accept a leadership position unless you're ready to pay a stiff price. The more substantial the outcome you seek to achieve, the more substantial the price you can expect to pay.

We came away from this weekend retreat with our eyes having been opened a little wider to the task before us as leaders. We agreed that one of the most important messages of the weekend is the focus on servant leadership. We discussed each DVD in detail. We talked about what this all meant for leading the congregation at Jenkins, and we will continue to do so in the days ahead. We have been challenged, and there is a deep desire to be the Godly leaders our church needs. Please pray for your leaders who serve now, and for future leaders, that we will all endeavor to lead in such a way that we can say with Paul, "If you want to be like Jesus, follow me."
