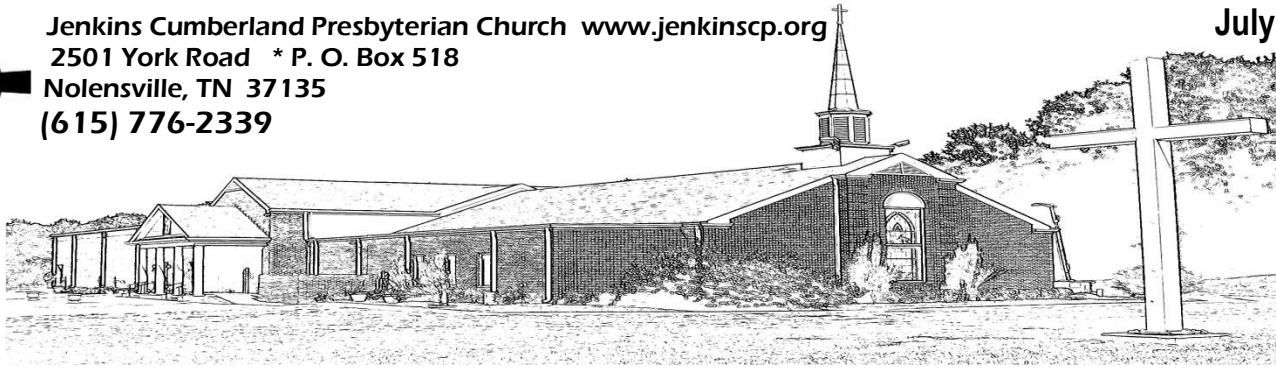

THE JENKINS JOURNEY

Midweek Ministry

This fall a midweek ministry could be a wonderful way to begin reaching families who might not find their way to Jenkins through any other means. Church growth statistics reveal most people come to church through the invitation of a friend. Parents will come to church at such an invitation. They will often stay at a church based on what it has to offer for their children. Parents usually look for churches that are offering quality events for youth and children.

Today I would like to share the creation and implementation of a midweek ministry that will provide quality Christian nurture, fun, excitement and learning for children and youth. It will also provide opportunity for adults of all ages, and parents of children to find a connection point within the ministries of the church. It will provide additional opportunities for fellowship, allow for the building of new relationships, and provide new and different places to get involved in ministry.

There are four areas of ministry which would make up the evening of our midweek ministry. The **dinner hour**, **bible study**, **activities**, and **worship skills** are the four areas of ministry. Let me take some time to explain each of the four areas. **The dinner hour (40 minutes)** is special because it is not just about sitting down to eat. There is a lot of preparation that goes into the dinner hour. A set up team comes in on Tuesday afternoon or evening and sets up the gym with tables and chairs. Wednesday morning the decoration crew comes to decorate the gym for the evening theme. The kitchen team has already had someone purchase food on Tuesday and during the early Wednesday afternoon they will begin preparation of the evening meal.

The dinner hour has structure and a purpose behind everything that is done during this special time. First, the MC leads the Dinner Hour from beginning to end. The MC leads the table parents in prayer before the youth and children come into the gym. The table parents are individuals or couples who sit at the table with a particular age group each week and get to know them and help them in table games and any needs that will arise. The MC makes announcements, uses creative and humorous ideas to choose who will be the table server for the evening, leads in prayer for the meal, and then the servers go to the kitchen to receive the food needed to serve their table. The MC makes announcements and after the meal leads the youth and children in silly table games or crazy competitions. The MC will usually pick best dressed adult, youth, and child according to the theme for each dinner hour. The fun, the relationships, and the special atmosphere are some of the things that make the dinner hour a highlight of each midweek event. Children get the message that they are special, important, and cared for by the entire church and ultimately by God. They see Christian life can be fun and learning can be exciting. Midweek ministry is special because it is not only about what is being taught, but about what is being caught. This ministry is about nurturing youth, children, and adults.

The clean-up crew comes in after dinner to clean up the kitchen for the cooking team. The decoration team has individuals who will remove the decorations and store them for future use. The tear down crew comes in to clean up once the children are through with the gym for the evening.

Bible study (35 minutes) classes would compliment Sunday school by using a different curriculum so as not to duplicate what is happening on Sunday morning.

Activities (35 minutes) can be games, crafts, building activities, team building activities, etc...

Worship skills (35 minutes) is a time for learning why we worship the way we do. Children need to understand why we say the Apostle's Creed and the Lord's Prayer. They need to know why we light candles when we begin worship and all such things. They also need to experience worship and have opportunity to sing as choirs. Worship skills classes could share their gifts of worship on Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights. It can also be an opportunity for youth to worship together and give Youth worship bands an opportunity to lead youth in worship.

Please pray for leaders to be called, and about giving (35 or 40 minutes) to share in a special ministry. Prayerfully consider attending the next information meeting for this midweek ministry. Thank You!
