

Even though the accommodations were not that big, the hospitality and blessings were enormous, and I would not trade that home experience for a suite in a five star resort...... The scenic view is not the only thing special about this home. You can see it in the love and care this family shared with a perfect stranger in their home. You can see it in their faces as they cherish the Word of God through their Bible. You can see it in the hours spent in service, worship and prayer. You can see and hear it as you hear a sound as you start up the eight flights of stairs to the fourth floor. It is not the sound of cartoons or game shows or sit coms. It is the sound of love as a young mother sings to her baby. However, she is not singing "Mary had a Little Lamb" or "Rock-a-by-Baby". She sings, "Christo es mi vida" (Christ is my life). She is already sharing the good news of the gospel with her precious gift from God. These are sermons that will live in my heart and mind as long as I live.
