John 12:1-16

- ¹ Six days before the Passover, Jesus arrived at Bethany, where Lazarus lived, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. ² Here a dinner was given in Jesus' honor. Martha served, while Lazarus was among those reclining at the table with him. ³ Then Mary took about a pint of pure nard, an expensive perfume; she poured it on Jesus' feet and wiped his feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume.
- ⁴ But one of his disciples, Judas Iscariot, who was later to betray him, objected, ⁵ "Why wasn't this perfume sold and the money given to the poor? It was worth a year's wages. ⁶ He did not say this because he cared about the poor but because he was a thief; as keeper of the money bag, he used to help himself to what was put into it.
- ⁷ "Leave her alone," Jesus replied. "It was intended that she should save this perfume for the day of my burial. ⁸ You will always have the poor among you, but you will not always have me."
- ⁹ Meanwhile a large crowd of Jews found out that Jesus was there and came, not only because of him but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. ¹⁰ So the chief priests made plans to kill Lazarus as well, ¹¹ for on account of him many of the Jews were going over to Jesus and putting their faith in him. ¹² The next day the great crowd that had come for the Feast heard that Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem.
- ¹³ They took palm branches and went out to meet him, shouting, "Hosanna! "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Blessed is the King of Israel!" ¹⁴ Jesus found a young donkey and sat upon it, as it is written, ¹⁵ "Do not be afraid, O Daughter of Zion; see, your king is coming, seated on a donkey's colt." ¹⁶ At first his disciples did not understand all this. Only after Jesus was glorified did they realize that these things had been written about him and that they had done these things to him.



Volunteers needed for Christian Education programs

Vacation Bible School director: Plans, organizes, promotes, and directs VBS. Recruits and manages volunteers. Tentative plans for 2012 VBS are for the evenings of June 18, 19 & 20.

Vacation Bible School volunteers: Help with Bible study, games, projects, preschool, music, kitchen, decorating, and more.

Sunday School Teachers for Preschool, Middle School and High School: Prepare and lead lessons on Sunday mornings; curriculum will be provided. Middle and High School teachers are needed immediately; Preschool teacher would begin in June. Substitutes are also needed.

Sunday School Crew leaders: Lead a "crew" of 4 elementary –aged kids, helping them with activities, discussing questions posed by the teacher, and praying together. Volunteer whenever you are able. Sign up sheet on the bulletin board next to the library.
