
We may do a variety of work but it will include painting and construction work.

# **Independence** Day

Independence is such a wonderful word. It sounds like freedom ringing from a thousand hilltops. I would take away a privilege and the response would be something like this, "You can't do this to me it's a free country." I can remember thinking, "At least they are teaching history at school."

We are called to be responsible citizens as we exercise our freedom. We pledge our allegiance to a nation that provides our freedom. How much more should we pledge our allegiance to the One who bought our freedom on the cross?
