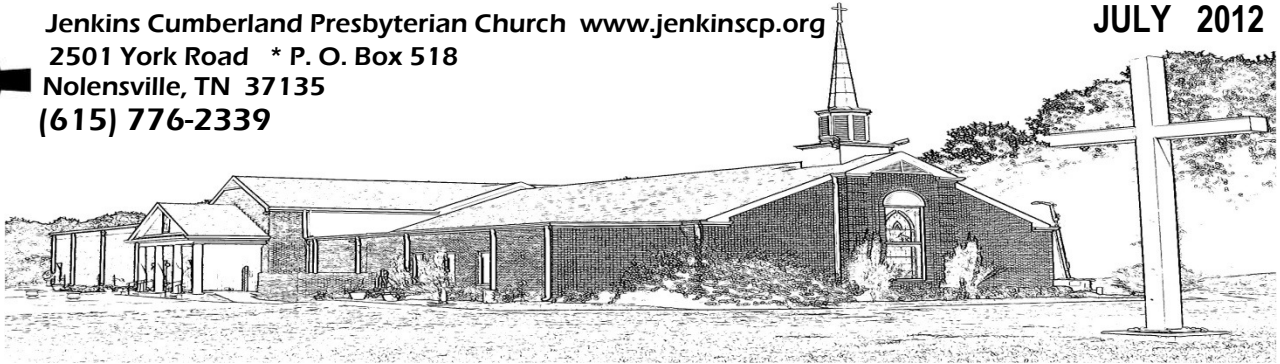

Independence Day

Independence is such a wonderful word. It sounds like freedom ringing from a thousand hilltops. We celebrate our independence on the same day every year because this day is the day our forefathers signed the Declaration of Independence. Independence Day is commonly associated with fireworks, parades, barbeques, carnivals, fairs, picnics, concerts, baseball games, family reunions, and political speeches and ceremonies, in addition to various other public and private events celebrating the history, government, and traditions of the United States. The 4th day of July will be filled with fun activities because we are celebrating the enjoyment of freedom.

We must also remember that freedom always comes at a very high cost. Americans spent years fighting oppression and tyranny, battle after bloody battle, and a war that cost countless lives. We know that many of those who fought for our nation were not well equipped for the harsh winters. I can still remember as a boy in history class learning about the number of troops under then General George Washington's command who had no shoes and socks marching in the harsh conditions of a northern winter. Many of those troops froze to death on the way to battle.

The freedom we share in Christ came at the highest price. Jesus suffered, bled, and died on the cross and we can't even begin to imagine the suffering he endured. We enjoy spiritual freedom today because Jesus was willing to suffer for us. Freedom always has a price.

The concern today is that we will forget the cost of freedom. The danger of forgetting the cost of freedom is that we will use our freedom selfishly. Some view independence as being independence from responsibility, and freedom as freedom from rules and laws. We must always remember with freedom comes responsibility.

When the children were in elementary school I can remember having to discipline them for certain actions. I would take away a privilege and the response would be something like this, "You can't do this to me it's a free country." I can remember thinking, "At least they are teaching history at school."

We are called to be responsible citizens as we exercise our freedom. We pledge our allegiance to a nation that provides our freedom. How much more should we pledge our allegiance to the One who bought our freedom on the cross?
