

INTRODUCTION OF MICAH WATSON

As you know, we have been without a Youth Leader since earlier this year. The Christian Education Committee (comprised of Debra Eckert (Chair), Julie Bomar (Sunday School Superintendent), Sally Turko, and Allan Stout) met to address this issue back in March. We began reporting to the Session our progress each month.

First, CE representatives met with the Finance Committee back in April to discuss the feasibility of hiring a Youth Leader. We were authorized to search and find a Youth Leader, believing in faith that the spiritual welfare of the church and especially youth (both in the church and the un-churched in our area) are vitally important to our church's mission.

Concurrently, the CE Committee developed a "Youth Leader Responsibilities" document (a listing of job responsibilities and accountability requirements), as well as a "Youth Worker Guideline and Policy" document (which details ethical responsibilities and standards of integrity).

Around June, we interviewed two candidates for a part-time Youth Leader position. Both were well-qualified and strong candidates.

We also around that time developed a "Monthly CE Committee and Session Report". This Report details the hours worked by the Youth Leader, details the youth activities they are leading and provides feedback from the CE or Session on their performance. It is a tool to support the Youth Leader and their growth and development.

Last month, both of the candidates' references were interviewed and CE made a recommendation to Session which was approved.

Some of the comments from the Youth Leader references included: has a servant's heart; energy to serve and self-motivator; desire to do the best he can do.

We are pleased to announce Jenkins part-time Youth Leader, Micah Watson.

My name is Micah Watson and I am a senior at Middle Tennessee State University. My major is Global Studies, which focuses on learning about cultures all over the world and how they interact with each other or with other cultures. After MTSU I plan to attend Memphis Theological Seminary. I feel my calling is to focus on young adult ministry and I hope to do that in the Cumberland Presbyterian church. Our denomination needs more focus in that area. At MTSU I am currently involved with a young adult ministry called the Presbyterian Student Fellowship. I have in the PSF house for the last two years and attended there the last four. At PSF I serve on the student leadership team as well as coordinate our intramural teams. Sports is something that I am very passionate about and play almost everyone you can think of. PSF is also a very mission focused organization and during my time in college I have been on foreign mission trips three times and several local ones. Only one of the foreign trips was with PSF but all the local trips were through PSF. For the last three years I have been a part-time employee of Lewis Bakeries Inc. (Bunny Bread) in Murfreesboro.
