ALWAYS BE FILLED WITH THE SPIRIT

During the late 1700's the frontier extended from Nashville, TN to Bowling Green, KY as far west as the Tennessee River. This region was called the Cumberland Region. The Presbyterian Church called their Presbytery in that particular region Cumberland Presbytery. Many new churches were being formed as more and more people were moving to the area. The ministers in this Presbytery were calling for revival and many were leading their congregations in regular prayer meetings and special services asking for God's Spirit to be poured out on their region and its people. Around the turn of the century the intensity of God's Spirit was becoming evident as the masses were drawn to the meetings and cries of repentance were heard in the woods even before a meeting would begin. Soon the camp meeting was born, as people would stay for weeks at a time to be in the presence of God. The revival was under way and the Presbytery was growing. The larger body of the Presbyterian Church misunderstood the revival and its preachers. It would also be fair to say the revival and the reality of the power of the Holy Spirit to change lives resulted in radical changes in the beliefs of these revival ministers. Eventually the Presbyterian Church dissolved Cumberland Presbytery, but that was not the end of the revival, its ministers, or their Presbytery.

February 4th, 1810 was the date Cumberland Presbytery formerly of the Presbyterian Church was reorganized by Rev. Finis Ewing, Rev. Samuel King, and Rev. Samuel McAdow. Cumberland Presbytery eventually grew into what is known today as the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. Our church was born out of this great revival movement of God's Spirit referred to as The Second Great Awakening. The ministers of this revival were empowered with God's Spirit and emboldened to minister and stand against all opposition. We should take heart in the knowledge of such spiritual heritage and endeavor to seek for the outpouring of God's Spirit in our own day to make us such committed and powerful witnesses as these.

B.W. McDonnold, author of History of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, 1888, states in Chapter 5, "the chief actors in the revival of 1800 had this New Testament baptism of the Holy Ghost." "The first proof of this fact is found in the abiding nature of their spirituality." Other proofs given were, the extraordinary power of their preaching, their lofty faith, and their practical consecration to Christ. "The Rev. H.A. Hunter, who knew them all, gave it as his opinion that the chief difference between them and modern preachers lay in their consciousness of God's abiding presence." McDonnold states, "There is no part of Cumberland Presbyterian History of greater practical importance than the subject of this chapter. The danger in modern times is that men will forget to seek this new anointing from the Holy Spirit."

I have no doubt that what God started in the founders of this denomination was never to be forgotten, but rather enhanced and built upon for future generations. May we, as they, tarry in Jerusalem until we are endued with power from on high, and "... be filled with the Spirit." Eph 5:18

JENKINS VISION CONFERENCE

Was held January 12, 2013, 10:00am to 2:30pm with lunch furnished by the Kitchen Committee. The highlights of our presentations were as follows:

- **MDO** is in its 24th year and growing. 10% to 20% of families attending MDO have no church home. By involving ourselves more with this ministry, we could bring families closer to the Lord, and perhaps, into our church.
- **Building and Grounds** stressed the need for upkeep of our church building. Suggestions include newsletter information and a bulletin board for B&G to post needs, and individuals can sign up to take on a project.
- **Christian Education** shared ways in which they lead the congregation in spiritual growth and evangelism. Over 90 children attended VBS, with many of our youth serving as helpers. Sunday School reaches about 60 people each week. Micah Watson, our youth minister, shared the progress being made with weekly meetings on Sunday and Wednesday nights, and his future plans and goals for our youth. Three workshops of interest to church members and community will be held in 2013.
- **Outreach** showed us the many areas of helps ministry in which Jenkins church is involved. Outreach assists local students who are in need through year-round and holiday programs.
