The Great Physician; part 1

"Come Under His Care" by Jeanni Watson

The way of the wicked is like darkness; they do not know what makes them stumble. Proverbs 4:19 Have you ever played hiding-go-seek in a dark room only to bump into a table, walk into a wall or trip over a stool? It is a lot of fun until you knock out a tooth or black an eye. Reality is, when we are in a place of darkness, it is almost impossible for us to see where we are going. We usually keep very still so that our other senses kick in and help us find our way around in the dark.

A person is born with a natural built-in, God-given ability to protect oneself from harm. We know this as **natural instinct**. We were equipped with extra senses so that if one of them were to become impaired, the other senses would take over and help. For instance, if someone loses their sight; the sense of hearing, smell, touch and taste are heightened to help them with whatever they may need.

This same principle applies to any emotional, mental or spiritual loss that could occur in one's life. The emotional loss of a parent during a divorce can cause a child to feel estranged from one or both parents. That detachment ultimately can make the child feel unloved and rejected which can lead to low self esteem or other emotional hindrances. The natural response for the child would be to protect him or herself from the pain of rejection. Some children put up walls of defense that come in various forms, such as bitterness, anger, fearfulness, and insecurity. Let's compare this to an open sore or wound, if left unattended the wound could eventually develop into a nasty infection and become septic. When it becomes septic it festers and becomes diseased, which can lead to a horrible scar, the loss of a limb or even death.

Getting to the truth! The way to deal with any sickness or disease is to find the source that started it in the first place. As with any wound, the doctor may need to do a blood test, check medical history and ask when and how the wound happened. They may need to get a closer look of the wound area by using imaging tests, x-rays, etc. This way they can check for foreign objects. The doctor may take a culture test by sampling fluid or a piece of tissue from the wound to send to the lab. Doing all these things help determine what kind of infection it is and how to treat it and become **free** of the hindrance. This is getting to the truth!

John 8:31-32 'Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, "If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed. 32And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." In the same way GETTING TO THE TRUTH, is what is needed in examining our own lives spiritually and emotionally. As with any wound we may have to take a closer look to be able to see how to deal correctly with it. Treatment requires knowing and understanding when and how things got started in the first place. This is not an easy process and can be very painful. Needles hurt! Probing and finding out how and when the problem began is to be determined when we come to certain truths about our past. The blood test and medical history represents taking a microscopic look at our family history to examine what traits and propensities may have been handed down genetically or spiritually. Imaging tests and x-rays represent taking an internal look at ourselves to examine any other issues that may be going on. We may also need a spiritual culture test to see what foreign deceptions and lies we may have come to believe as truths. These are called spiritual strongholds. Once we have determined the diagnosis and source of infection, then we can start the treatment of cleansing and healing.

Cleansing! Usually any treatment of a wound can be painful. It needs to start with a good cleansing, depending on how severe, its location and whether other areas are affected. It also depends on the length of time one may have had the wound. Wound cleansing usually starts with soap and water to wash away the germs. You rinse with sterile water or germ killing solutions for the removal of dirt or dead tissue. You may also need to drain the wound to clean out any pus.

The Hidden Things! The purpose of a cleansing is to help wash away the hidden things so that they can be revealed, dealt with and cured. Coming to the truth about oneself is quite painful. Dirt, germs, dead tissue and pus all represent the ugly sins, resentments, anger and lies that keep us in the place of bondage and pain. *(Continued on page 2)*
