### Rock City Ministry Descriptions Call Sunday September 1<sup>st</sup>

### **Ministry opportunities**

**Set-up Team** – Set up tables and chairs each Tuesday afternoon. Time 30 -40 minutes.

**Theme Team** – Decorate tables & room according to the theme of the week and set tables with dinner wear. Decorating Tuesday night or Wed. Time 60 minutes
