PRAYER GARDEN BRICK PAVERS ARE NOW AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE

We are pleased to announce the purchase of memorial and honorary brick pavers for the new prayer garden to be constructed outside the south doors of the vestibule. We wish to create a beautiful quiet area which emphasizes the importance of prayer.

A place where one can commune with God in nature, and remember loved ones who have finished their race and honor those whom we love. There are order forms available to be completed. Each brick paver can have three lines of text with 18 characters on each line. The 18 characters include spaces, commas, quotations mark, etc...

Brick pavers are \$50.00 each. The funds collected from your purchases will be used to pay for the brick pavers and their engraving, and the cost of construction of the prayer garden. A pergola is to be constructed the length of the sidewalk just outside the south entrance. The prayer garden with brick pavers will be constructed on the other side of the sidewalk that runs the length of the sanctuary. Beautiful landscaping (in part to hide the light pole and gas tank) will be a part of this project, prayer benches, a cross that can be seen from the vestibule, and moving the gas tank further to the west will be involved in the 1st phase of this project.

TEAMWORK

"The strength of the team is each individual member. The strength of each member is the team." — Phil Jackson, coach with the highest winning percentage in NBA history, including six NBA championships with the Chicago Bulls and five with the Los Angeles Lakers.

"Coming together is a beginning. Keeping together is progress. Working together is success." — Henry Ford, founder of the Ford Motor Company which he built into an automobile empire.

"Little things make the big things happen" — John Wooden, UCLA men's basketball head coach who won 10 NCAA national championships in a 12 year period, seven in a row. His teams won a record 88 consecutive games during this seven year period. He was named national coach of the year six times.

"A major reason capable people fail to advance is that they don't work well with their colleagues." — Lee Iacocca, automobile industry executive, who engineered the Ford Mustang and Ford Pinto and led the revival of Chrysler Corporation while serving as its President and CEO from 1978 until his retirement at the end of 1992.

"Teamwork is essential: that is what makes a team work, a company work, a society work, a civilization work."—Vince Lombardi, head coach, Green Bay Packers (1959 -1967). Possibly the most successful NFL coach ever, he led his team to 5 league championships in 7 years (3 straight), won the first two Super Bowls, and never had a losing season in the NFL.

"I am a member of a team, and I rely on the team, I defer to it and sacrifice for it, because the team, not the individual, is the ultimate champion."— Mia Hamm, forward for the US women's national soccer team which won Olympic Gold in 1996, Olympic Silver in 2000, and Olympic Gold in 2004. She is the 2nd highest scorer in either men's or women's soccer.

"None of us, including me, ever do great things. But we can all do small things, with great love, and together we can do something wonderful."— Mother Teresa, founder of the Missionaries of Charity, over 4,500 sisters who run hospices & homes for people with HIV/AIDS, leprosy and tuberculosis; soup kitchens; orphanages; and schools. Members take vows of chastity, poverty and obedience, and vow to give wholehearted and free service to the poorest of the poor.

Each of these individuals has achieved incredible, extraordinary accomplishments in his or her area of interest and vision. Business men, coaches, players, and a woman given to the Lord in ministry, all illustrate for us that while individuals can have vision it takes a team to achieve the highest levels of excellence.
